Dear Brother Richard

We did not ^{commence} go to school last second day but will certainly go next week, Willie is not going with us but to Frank Tilton again, Susan our girl that had that bad fellow on her finger has come back, her finger which is her fore one on her right hand is perfectly straight, I went to Mr Lamberts the (boss) spinner of the woollen factory to tea this afternoon there were several other girls besides myself there, we enjoyed our selves very much indeed and returned home about half past six very much pleased with our visit Mary, Marcella, Eveline and myself intend going out to Cousin Emeline Bacoins to spend the day, tomorrow Father is going to take us as far as the toll gate and we can walk the rest of the way it is just a pleasant

walk, from there, I hope we will enjoy our-
selves in our next we will give thee a description
of our visit; Dorcas and Thoma Purdie have
been ~~travelling~~ ^{travelling} this three weeks but are expected
home tomorrow, I must now close so Goodbye

the corn in the field next to the house I am very
glad so that we can see the road once more.
