Representation in Existing Surveys

Description South Carolina Inventory of Historic Places, 1983

Hewn-timber tobacco barn with steep, metal-covered gable roof. Metal-roofed shed, which is supported by undressed wood posts, surrounds all sides. Gable ends are weatherboarded. Arched brick firebox and brick flue are located on right elevation. Three-fourths of chimney has been rebuilt with cement block. Wood plank (1" x 6") doors are located on facade and rear.

Significance

The Dew Barn, which is essentially intact, is a significant example of tobacco barn construction in Dillon and Marion Counties from ca. 1895 to the 1950s. The barn is believed to have been constructed before 1935.

Acreage

Verbal Boundary Description

The nominated property is shown as the red line on the accompanying Marion County Tax Map #10, drawn at a scale of 1 inch = 400 feet. This boundary includes only the historic building and its immediate setting.
