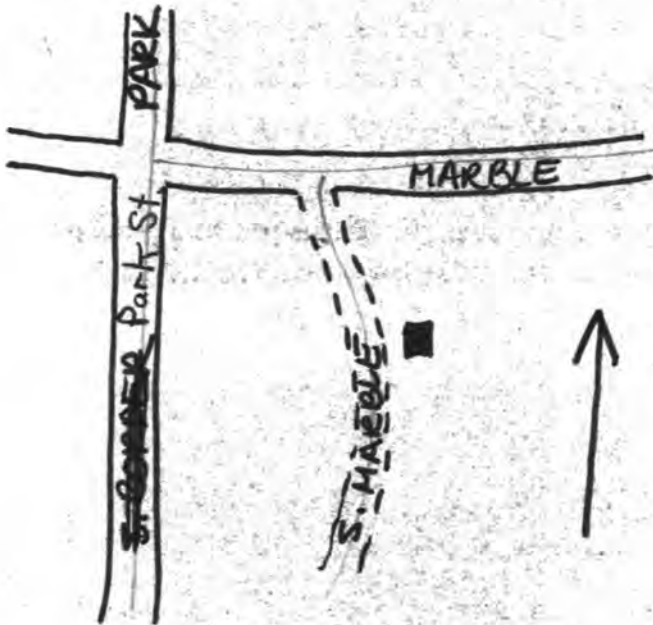

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

6 South Marble Street is Stoneham's only intact example of a modest artisan's house from the early nineteenth century. Constructed ca. 1810, it is five bays long by one room deep, and rises two stories from an uncoursed granite foundation to a pitched roof. It is covered by clapboards with cornerboards and fascia moldings. The center entry and windows are simply framed; the entry is protected by a twentieth century porch and the windows contain 2/2 or 6/6 sash.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

6 South Marble Street possesses integrity of location, design, setting, materials, and workmanship. It is significant as Stoneham's only intact early nineteenth century worker's house and as the only surviving fragment of Stoneham's early marble quarrying industry. It meets criterion A of the National Register of Historic Places.

This residence is a survivor of a period when South Marble Street was the main route from the town center to the Marble Quarry; it likely served as a quarry worker's home. Architecturally, it is representative of the modest houses which once stood on early routes in the portions of town which developed in the early nineteenth century. South Marble Street is unique among these early routes in remaining unimproved since its distinction ended in the nineteenth century.

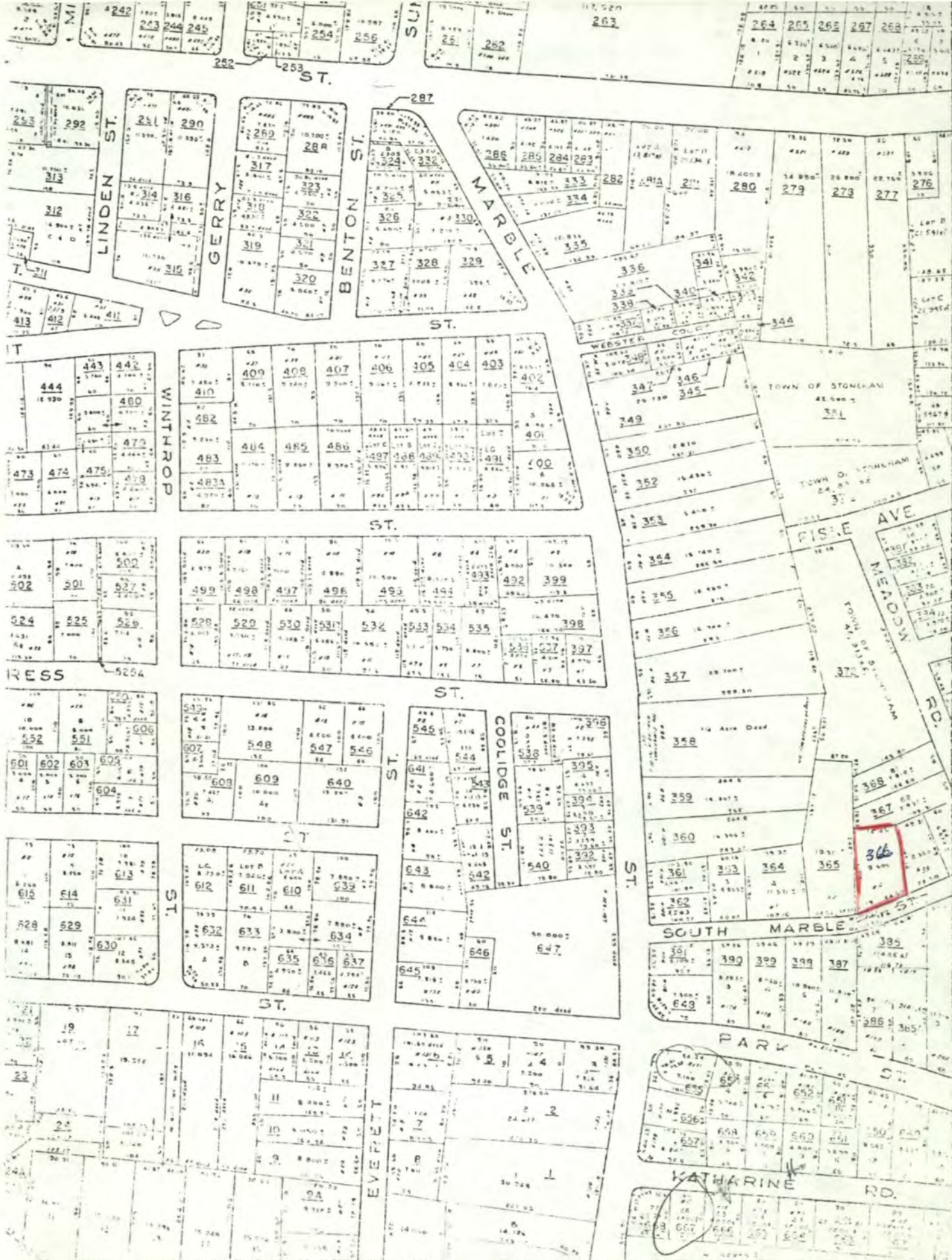
