At the corners of the building are fluted pilasters with Art Deco floral motif capitals. Present near the roofline are also three bronze decorative medallions. The interior consists of concrete floors, walls and ceilings with open floor space and few original partitions. Some remodeling has taken place on the first floor but few changes have occurred to the rest of the building.

The Rich Schwartz building was constructed ca. 1930 and is one of the few commercial buildings in downtown Nashville displaying elements of the Art Deco style. Designed by Marr and Holman, the building has a polished granite storefront, multi-light casement windows and understated Art Deco decoration. It was built on property owned by Howell Campbell whose family retained possession of the property until recent years. The building has been occupied by several clothing stores with the Rich Schwartz
