DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Evergreen is located on 9.7 acres of land at 3300 Falls Road, just north of the Hampden exit ramp of the Jones Falls Expressway, on a high promontory overlooking the Jones Falls Valley. The property includes, in addition to the mansion, a valve house, two modern concrete kennels, and manager's residence. (This nomination, while covering the entire acreage, is based upon two structures: the mansion and the valve house.)

Situated on the crest of the hill, the mansion enjoys a spectacular view to the south of the entire business district of the city. The brick structure is a rural version of the Victorian Ttalianate style. It is two and one half stories high at present, although an early photograph and painting 1 show a large square cupola dominating the roofline at the intersection of the crossgables. This has been removed and capped, and together with the conversion of one window into a door on the north side of the kitchen wing, appears to be the only substantial exterior alteration.

The front facade on the north consists of three blocks: the main entrance is located in the slightly offcenter front block. The double door is paneled and has a fan-shaped window above with narrow round-topped windows flanking it. The arched trim over the entrance was painted black several years ago, which sets off the form, but is not traditional locally. Above the doorway in the same block is a three part window: a narrow round-topped central window with rectangular windows on either side. A bracketed canopy extends over them.

The main block, which extends to the rear of the house, is pierced to the left of the entrance by a double window with canopy on the first floor and a single window above. These windows and all others in the house have brick jack arches and stone sills and louvered wooden shutters.

The kitchen wing forms the remaining block. It is to the right of the entrance and has a door and window on the first floor and two windows directly above them on the second floor. There is a series of wooden brackets below the roof cornice on all sides of the house.

The west facade is bare except for two attic windows with four over four lights. On this side of the house is a sloping terrace with many old boxwoods. A small pet cemetery has been made on one of the terraces.

The south facade faces the remains of a formal box garden beyond which are the modern kennels and office building. The kitchen end corresponds to the northern side of the same wing. There is a large concrete porch extending across the remainder of this facade. It is approached by four steps with a modern wrought iron railing. TATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Evergreen on the Falls is an important feature in the history of the mill towns of the Jones Falls Valley, especially Woodberry and Hampden, for it was the home of the supervisor of the Mount Vernon Mills, Albert HV Carroll. (Other structures in this neighborhood which have already been placed on the National Register are the Londontown Manufacturing Company and Poole and Hunt Company.) This mansion was built about 1860 by a Henry Snyder of Baltimore County, about whom very little is known. He is credited with planting the fine evergreens and terracing the slopes around the house, possibly with earth taken from the construction of the Hampden Reservoir which was completed during the time of the Snyders' residence. Snyder died in 1864 and his widow leased the estate briefly to James Hooper, owner of the Meadow Mill and others, and the son of William Hooper who had been instrumental in bringing the cotton industry to the Jones Falls Valley.

The property was sold to David Carroll, another pioneer in the manufacture of cotton yarn and duck and co-owner of the Mount Vernon Mills. David Carroll's son, Albert, superintendent of the mills, became the occupant of the estate and continued to live there until about 1903. The Carrolls added to the landscaping by creating formal boxwood gardens and planting extensively so that the property became the showplace of the area. An account of their gracious lifestyle has been preserved in an essay by a daughter, Mary Grace Carroll, which is now owned by Mrs. Wilson K. Barnes of Baltimore. Her detailed description of the interior furnishings and decor of the house have been invaluable aids in modern re-decorating projects. She also reveals that the observatory which has since been removed commanded a view as far as the Baltimore Harbor, and she tells of stables, kennels and other outbuildings which have long since disappeared. The Carrolls were especially generous employers and gave the neighborhood land for the Mount Vernon Methodist Episcopal Church.

The estate was left in the care of a custodian from about 1903 until 1926 when it was sold to the Maryland Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, the present

owner. Although there have been two costly fires, the Society has maintained the mansion in excellent condition, rebuilding and refurnishing it after each episode. The interior is not original, but efforts have been made to preserve the atmosphere of a gracious and comfortable country seat. And although it has been necessary to build kennels and other structures required for the operation of the humane society, these have been placed in an inconspicuous location behind the house and restricted in height, so that the passerby notices only the curving driveway, ancient trees and the picturesque house.

The other structure of note on the property is the This was constructed in conjunction with valve house. the Hampden Reservoir and completed in 1861. (There are two similar structures built by the Water Department at approximately the same time and located several miles north along the right-of-way between the water source, Lake Roland, and Hampden.) This building was acquired by the Society in 1959 at which time the reservoir had been filled and the City was constructing the Jones Falls Expressway. The City exchanged about two acres of former reservoir land for a like amount of land on the south of the Evergreen property on which to build an expressway ramp. At present the Society is using the valve house for storage.
