18. Description The house is of frame construction and is set on a rusticated limestone foundation. The house is asymmetrical with a porte-cochere, and a varigated roofline with gables and dormers. The structure has a porch across the main facade with columns set on limestone plinths.		30. 19. History This house was built about 1898 for J.L. Shallcross. This was the third Shallcross residence in Anchorage. Shallcross was active in civic affairs and was commissioner of Roads from 1887 to 1893 and President of the Town Board from 1893 to 1912. He was a retired river-boat captain who was later in the insurance business. It was built by Wm. B. Wood.		31. Endangered Yes No
