Description:

The Haynes Mason House is a double pen log residence constructed ca. 1810. The house was originally built in a double pen design with exterior brick chimneys. One-story log additions were later added ca. 1830 at the rear of the house. The log structure was covered with weatherboard ca. 1880. Windows in the house are six-over-six sash except on the rear addition where they are one-over-one sash. At the main entrance is a ca. 1900 glass and frame door with a small transom. On the south facade is an original frame door with a four light transom. The house has a gable roof of metal standing seam and a stone pier foundation. The interior retains original Federal style mantles. There are no significant outbuildings.

Statement of Significance:

The Haynes Mason House is a notable example of a double pen log residence of the early 19th century and illustrates the typical progression of county log structures. The original double pen log section was constructed ca. 1810 by Haynes Mason, a farmer and settler of the early 19th century. Around 1830 a rear one-story log ell wing was added and ca. 1880 the house was covered with weatherboard. These additions to the original log section are typical progressions found in log residences in the county. Only a few log residences, however, remain standing or have not been altered in recent years. The Haynes Mason House has not been significantly changed since the late 19th century and retains its design and form.

Verbal Boundary Description and Justification:

The boundary for the Haynes-Mason House is illustrated on the accompanying Hardin County property tax map 176, lot 7, and is defined by fencelines to the south and west, a driveway to the north, and Mason Road to the east. The boundary includes the house and property sufficient to protect the historical setting of the site but excludes modern outbuildings to the west.
