Describe the prosent and original (if known) physical appearance

The Buck Memorial Library is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ -story building of High Victorian Gothic design. The building forms an "L" in plan, with the door and entrance porch at the angle. A hall and desk area just inside the front door separate the "library room" to the left from the "reading room" to the right. A small librarian's office behind the desk area completes the programme.

The building's walls are of rough-cut granite ashlar from the nearby Blue Hill quarries. The water table, a string-course, and other ornamental details are of the same granite, but dressed. Granite chimney stacks servicing fireplaces in the library and reading rooms extend above the west and north walls respectively. A flight of granite steps connects the entrance porch with a sidewalk below. The entrance porch and front slopes of the roof drain into a granite gutter.

The library roof is a steeply-pitched gable covered with Maine slate. All vertical and ridge flashings are of copper. The eaves are flashed with another sheet metal.

The window sash of the library room are arched 1/1's. The sash of the reading room are squared 1/1's with multipaned borders. The two sash on the east gable end have multipaned transoms.

The original interior finish is entirely intact. All woodwork is of milled hard pine varnished with linseed oil. Most interior doors have five rectangular transoms, and are topped by multipaned transoms. The door between the desk area and the librarian's office has a multipaned light and matching surround. All walls are of plaster above beaded tongue and groove wainscotting. The wooden mantel in the reading room is neo-colonial in design. The reading room has an arched brick fireplace and exposed chimney throat.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Buck Memorial Library is one of four fine public libraries designed for Maine coastal towns by George Clough of Boston and Blue Hill, Maine. Together with the Porter Public Library in Machias (NR)(1891-93), the Vinalhaven Public Library (1906) and the Rockland Public Library, the Buck Memorial Library is one of the most architecturally sophisticated small library buildings in the state. The building is also one of the more important smaller commissions of prolific architect George Clough. Following a successful Boston practice, Clough retired permanently to his native town of Blue Hill, Maine in the 1890's, having been a summer resident there for over a decade. The Buck Library is one of Clough's earlier Maine commissions, completed only a year after his huge Suffolk County Courthouse in Boston.

The building is also among the most notable small examples of Romanesque Revival architecture in Maine. The articulation of the library room windows and use of rough ashlar are very much in the manner of H.H. Richardson, whose series of important library buildings in Massachusetts were doubtlessly familiar to Clough.

The library building was a gift to the town of Bucksport by the widow and daughter of R.P. Buck, Esq., a member of a prominent local family, who became a successful merchant in New York City. The building is one of a series of late nineteenth century public buildings in small Maine towns funded entirely by local sons, who had made fortunes in other states. At least two other Clough-designed buildings, the school in Dresden, Maine and the Porter Memorial Library in Machias, are in the same roster.
