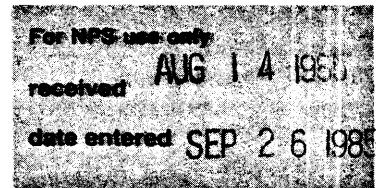

#604 Trujillo-Gonzales House, 935 New Mexico, ill. 21.

4. Owner: Eddie Trujillo, 935 New Mexico, Las Vegas, N.M.
7. Description: Stuccoed foundation; stuccoed adobe walls; corrugated metal roof; small eave overhang, small door in gable; 2/2 double-hung windows, wood casement windows (rear); boxed porch posts, railing, half-timbering. Located one block southwest of the Old Town Residential Historic District, on a hill which rises from the **Arroyo Gabonito**.
8. Significance: This is another notable example of the incorporation of Anglo materials and plans into the local Hispanic building tradition. The front section with its entry/hall flanked by two rooms was built some time in the last two decades of the nineteenth century. This simplest version of the center hall plan, is the innovation, while the adobe construction and placement on the ground are the traditional elements. About 1920, the porch and shed-roofed rear were added.
