#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The French-Parks House is significant because (1) it is one of the best examples of Victorian influence in the design of a residential structure in Tahlequah and (2) because of its historical association with J.T. Parks.

Completed in 1889, Johnson Thompson built the French-Parks House in a design influenced by the Victorian style with some characteristics of the Federal through its brick and symetry, and instances of the Carpenter Gothic (1870-1910). Features of this large brick house are a high-pitched roof, marble quoins, four five-window bays, and five fireplaces. The extensive use of redwood on verandas, windows, and bays was a rare or non-existent practice in Tahlequah in the 1880s. The interior retains all of the historic fabric, such as wood doors, floors, wainscoting, and beautiful stairways. Thompson was influential in the building of such important structures as the second Cherokee Female Seminary, a structure which remains as the center of the Northeastern State University campus. The French-Parks House was a wedding gift for his daughter Janana (Thompson) French. She and her husband, Robt. French, occupied the house until 1910.

In 1910 J.T. Parks (nephew of Johnson Thompson) purchased the house from the French family. Parks, a Cherokee, is historically significant to Cherokee County as the first elected county judge. He assumed the position in 1908 and served until 1913. He tried and disposed of 249 civil cases, 1,319 criminal cases, and 1,749 probate cases. As Cherokee County was a part of the Old Cherokee Nation, much of the land was owned by Indians and land title disputes were numerous. Therefore, much of his time was spent in hearing such cases, a very significant aspect of early state history in eastern Oklahoma. After holding the county judicial post, he continued a distinguished career as district judge. J.T. Parks and his family remained in the French-Parks House until just prior to the beginning of World War II.

#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The French-Parks House is an "L" shaped, modified Gothic, brick structure set upon a thirty inch thick stone foundation. The house has two levels and basement with exterior upper walls sixteen inches thick. The house is some forty-five hundred square feet with five rooms in the ground level and four rooms in the upper floor. The basement features the original kitchen, dining room and a cooling room with a flagstone floor.

The interior of the house features some seventeen original oak doors and hard-ware, wainscotting of alternating oak and walnut panels and five and one-half inch oak flooring. Also there are five bay windows and five fireplaces in the house.

The exterior brick walls have marble quoins hewn by a Cherokee stone mason and took over a year-to-produce. The contract of th

The structure has been renovated both interior and exterior with post-1910 additions being removed, interior finishes being restored to that same period.
