





Physical Description

This house designed by Charles Thompson in 1911 is characterized by simple, broad massing and Craftsman details. The two-story structure with front gable roof is faced with brown brick and features a full length front porch with shallow hipped roof supported by brick piers. Dominating the facade is the prominent front gable infilled with pseudo half-timbering and a group of four multi-paned windows. Large brackets accentuate the gable. Single gable roof dormers pierce the roof of the side elevations. Marking the ground floor facade is a plate glass front door and wide sash window with ten-over-one lights. The second story sash windows on the facade are arranged symmetrically and have six-over-one lights.

Statement of Significance

The Hudson House in Pine Bluff offers a good example of Charles L. Thompson's Craftsman styling in its most simple form. Built in 1913, the house is a two-story brick building featuring a prominent expanse of half-timbering effects in the gable end on the facade. A full length hip roof porch is found on the first floor of the facade. A spacious house, the design offers no pretentions and presents a solid Craftsman-like appearance.
