The pilasters at the corners rise to the cornice, the others to a stone bandcourse which articulates the cornice. The rest of the facade is sheathed in white glazed brick. The parapet has green rectangular motifs and stone crosses. An oversized metal cornice with large modillions and brackets gives a sense of monumentality to the structure.
