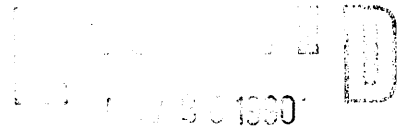

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The Thomas Patterson House is a two-story brick, five-bay, T-plan residence with Italianate detailing built ca. 1880. The house was built with a rear two-story brick ell. The house has a stone foundation, hipped roof of asphalt shingles, and exterior of common bond brick. The house has two interior wall chimneys and a central interior chimney in the rear ell. On the main (south) facade is a two-story metal and wood partial width shed porch. This porch has fluted columns and a concrete floor and was added in 1968. On the east facade of the house is a one-story enclosed porch which was added in 1948. On the west facade is an attached ca. 1970 open carport.

The main entrance has an original four panel wood door and sidelights and transom which have been enclosed with structural glass blocks. Windows are original four-over-four rectangular wood sash and are set within segmental brick arches. The windows have stone sills and original wood shutters. At the roof eaves are decorative Italianate brackets. A secondary entrance is located on the west facade which also has an original four panel door and sidelights and transom enclosed with structural blocks.

The interior retains much of its original design and detailing. This includes architrave molding around the doors and cast iron mantles of Italianate design. Doors are original four and five paneled wood design with three-light transoms.

The house is located on a large farm in a rural section of Larue County. At the rear of the house is an original, ca. 1880 one-story brick smokehouse which has a common bond exterior, gable roof of metal standing seam, and interior wall brick chimney. In the gable field is a vent window with an open brick weave in a diamond design. Also at the rear is a ca. 1960 frame garage which is non-contributing to the property.

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PROPERTY TYPE: Rural Residence, High Style Victorian, 1860-1940

The Thomas Patterson House is significant under criterion C for its architectural significance. The house is one of only two brick residences inventoried in the county from the late 19th century which were built with Italianate style influences. Despite changes to the porch and main entrance the house retains much of its original exterior and interior design and detailing. The house also retains a brick outbuilding which is associated with the original construction of the house.

This residence was built ca. 1880 by Thomas Patterson who purchased a 280 acre farm at this location from the Cotter family. Patterson employed several masons to build his residence and tradition states that some 750,000 bricks were fired and used in the construction of the house and smokehouse. Wages of \$2.50 per day were paid to the masons with the total cost of construction estimated at \$4,400. Patterson died in 1882 after living in his new house just two weeks. His property was then sold to W.T. Patterson who resided at the house until his death in 1919. The house was later owned by Branham Patterson and C.R. Beams before the present owner, Charles F. Beams, purchased the house in 1944.

The house was altered in 1948 with the addition of a screen porch in the rear ell and by the removal of the original porch and its replacement on the main facade in 1968. Despite these changes the original exterior plan and layout of the house remains as does its interior design and detailing.

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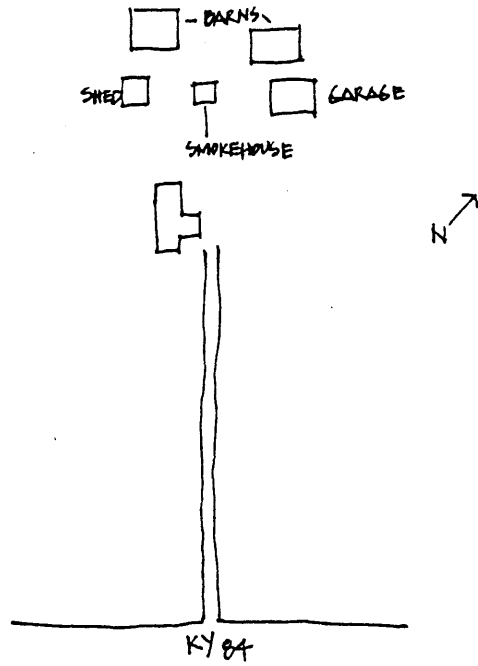

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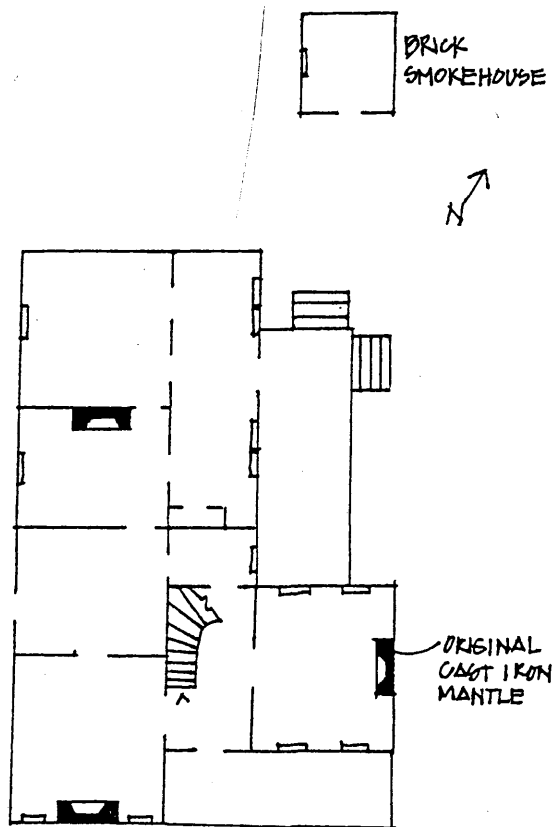
Boundary Description: The boundary for the Thomas Patterson House is illustrated on lot 16 of accompanying Larue County tax map 14. The boundary is oval shaped and consists of a driveway which encircles the house, smokehouse and non-contributing outbuilding.

Boundary Justification: The boundary for the Thomas Patterson House is drawn to include all properties which are associated with the property's period of significance. The boundary follows the line of a driveway which encircles the property and within this line is also a non-contributing garage. Excluded from this boundary to the north and east are modern or significantly altered outbuildings.
