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**Description** The Confederate Monument on the town square in Russellville is a limestone and bronze monument. The limestone portion of the monument consists of a base constructed of faced limestone blocks approximately six feet high. Upon this base is a bronze statute of a Confederate soldier in a slouch hat resting on his rifle. The soldier stands inside an arch and is flanked by arch supports that are inscribed on the front. Facing the monument the inscriptions read: "Confederate Soldiers 61-65" and "Camp Caldwell U.C.V. 139." On the rear of the monument an inscription on the left arch support reads: "Deo Vindice." The arch is topped with a bronze eagle approximately two feet high and two feet wide. The monument is approximately ten feet wide, four feet deep and 20 feet tall.

**Statement of Significance** The Confederate Monument in Russellville meets National Register criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This monument was erected in 1910 by the Camp Caldwell chapter of the United Confederate Veterans (UCV). This is one of the later examples of a monument erected by the UCV and it has many of the attributes of a monument erected in the 20th Century. It was placed in a public space and shows no signs of mourning, rather it is more a dignified tribute to the Confederacy. The laying of the monument's corner stone was a very public ceremony that included music and speeches. It is significant because it is a Civil War monument in Kentucky that was built before 1935 has not been severely altered and has not been moved. See registration requirements, pp. F-2 and pp. F-3 of the Multiple Property Documentation Form.

Verbal Boundary Description - The Confederate Monument whose boundaries form a circle with a radius of 15 feet centered on the monument located on the town square in Russellville, Kentucky.

**Verbal Boundary Justification** - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.
