

(#10. Significance, continued)

Pendleton County forms the highest and southermost part of the South Branch Valley. Generally, the landscape is rugged and sloping with relatively little level, fertile land. As a result, outside of the larger towns, most dwellings are small subsistance level frame or log buildings, reflecting the inability of the land to support large prosperous farms.

This large and sophisticated house with its elaborate Queen Anne detailing is unusual among the dwelling stock of Pendleton County, located outside of the towns. It is a stylistically refined structure showing numerous Queen Anne design features including two assymetrical polyagonal towers, contrasting wood siding placed in a herringbone pattern, projecting gables and bays and large brackets set off with contrasting color schemes.
