On the E end of the stone house site  
was/is a 1 story single room wing (photo 2)  
with interior end chimney; wing has  
pegged frames, ooslo trim, beaded  
batten door; breakfast mantel, <sup>(on ends)</sup> double (photo 5)  
faled, cyma molding, panelled corner  
blocks; porch across front of wing has  
later roof as does wing (ridge changed?); (photo 3)  
masonry painted white. N of the wing is  
a 19th C 2 room frame ell w central  
chimney & porch on E side. Rear (N) porch (photo 4)  
on house enclosed.

N. of the house is a fine brick  
snake house w diapered vents and a (photo 8)  
new cedar roof. E of the house are the  
sites of a log hemp house, mill, and  
distillery. Spring house N.E. of ~~front~~  
house. In the yard are mill stones  
from the mill site on S Elkhorn Creek.  
New house ca 1900 S of stone house which  
is now a tenant's house.

House located in midst of large working  
farm on small rise above spring branch  
of S. Elkhorn.

from Penn. lived on part of the property  
and ran a saw and grist mill on S. Elkhorn  
in 19th C. ~~Barriers were for~~ John Barrier was
