

A detailed description of the physical characteristics of the stone is given in the Boundary Markers of the Original District of Columbia Multiple Documentation Form.

Intermediate boundary marker Northeast #3 is located at the edge of a parking lot 144 feet northwest of the intersection of Eastern Avenue and Chillum Road. The sandstone marker is in fair condition. A 3' x 3' x 5' iron fence, in poor condition, surrounds the marker.

Northeast #3 boundary stone was the tenth marker to be located in Maryland. It was laid in 1792. Its fence was dedicated by the Our Flag Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution on October 16, 1916.

Verbal Boundary Description:

The stone is located approximately 144 feet northwest of the centerline of Chillum Road and 44 feet southwest of the centerline of Eastern Avenue. The fence surrounds the stone.

The boundary stone and fence have historically been situated at this location and maintain historic integrity.
