



# Bureau of Historic Preservation "The Grove"

Began by Richard Keith Call, twice Territorial  
Governor of Florida about 1839 and was occupied  
c. 1843. It descended thru the family to Mary  
Call Collins, and her husband, former Governor  
Le Roy Collins who also used it as a  
Governor's mansion -
