Located at the Columbia Training School, approximately one mile northeast of Columbia, Mississippi, the Superintendent's Home, designed in the Craftsman style and constructed in 1918, is a large two-story, white stuccoed, masonry house capped by a gable roof with broad overhanging eaves with a boxed cornice. brick chimneys pierce the roof; one at the northern gable end, the other at the roof ridge near the southern gable end. length, three bay, arcaded, shed-roofed front gallery supported by large square piers spans the western, or main, facade, end piers of the front gallery project above the roof line. facade of the first floor is symmetrically arranged with a group of four six-over-six, double-hung sash windows located to each side of the centrally located single-leaf, half-glass front door with sidelights. This arrangement is repeated on the second floor with a single six-over-six, double-hung sash window flanked by sidelights located over the front door. Centered on the southern elevation of the house is a one-story, flat-roofed wing that houses a bathroom and dressing room. Balancing this wing on the northern elevation, is a one-story, arcaded, flat-roofed porte-cochere with the same detailing as the front gallery. A one-story, gable-roofed wing on the eastern facade at the northeastern corner of the house contains the kitchen and service area.

The interior of the first floor is arranged as a double-pile, center hall plan with the living room expanding into what would have been the front half of the center hallway. The front door opens directly into the living room. The staircase is located in the back half of the center hall. Located behind the living room is the dining room, behind which is the kitchen wing. Occupying the space to the south of the hallway are two bedrooms and the projecting wing containing a bath and dressing room. The second floor is arranged as a double-pile, center hall plan with two bedrooms on each side of the hall. Located between the two bedrooms on the northern side of the hall is a bathroom.

The interior of the house enjoys a high degree of integrity, retaining its original doors, door and window molding, baseboards, mantelpieces and wainscoting in the dining room. The dogleg staircase is original and consists of a square paneled newel post, molded wooden handrail, and a balustrade composed of

wide pieces of wood with decorative cutouts. The mantelpieces in the living room and dining room are the most elaborate in the house, being constructed of brick with brick overmantel designs. The Living room overmantel design consists of a raised panel with a raised diamond design in the center; the dining room overmantel has a slightly smaller raised panel. The remainder of the mantelpieces are relatively simple wooden ones with Craftsman inspired details. The exterior also enjoys a high degree of integrity, retaining all original windows and doors and original front gallery and porte-cochere.

Located behind the house to the northeast is a non-contributing frame, gable-roofed, two-car garage built circa 1950. Also on the property are a goldfish pond with a random course stone edge and a random course stone barbecue grill, both of which appear to date to the 1930s. These features are considered to be contributing.

The house is currently vacant. However, the school has future plans to restore the building.

The Superintendent's Home at the Columbia Training School, built in 1918, is significant in the area of education for its association with the first reform school established in the State of Mississippi, from the opening of the school in 1918 until 1945 or fifty years prior to the preparation of this nomination (Criterion A).

The Mississippi Industrial and Training Institute, now Columbia Training School, was proposed by State Representative J. E. Norwood on January 13, 1916. This bill was signed into law by Governor Theodore G. Bilbo on March 28, 1916. The purpose of the school was to "train delinquent boys and girls who could not properly be dealt with at home or in the public schools". Under the provisions of this act, destitute and abandoned children were also admitted to the school.

The citizens of Marion County donated a 3,100 acre tract of farm land, some of which could be used for timber production, and gave an additional \$50,000.00 to help establish the school. The school opened in 1918. The Superintendent's Home is the only major building at the school to survive from its beginning. The majority of the original buildings were demolished in the 1960s and 1970s and replaced with new buildings.

The Superintendent's Home was designed by Xavier A. Kramer, an architect and businessman from McComb, Mississippi. He designed several county courthouses around the state namely the Walthall County courthouse (1916-17; listed in the National Register of Historic Places in November, 1994); the Stone County Courthouse at Wiggins (1917); the Humphreys County Courthouse at Belzoni (1921); and the Bolivar County Courthouse at Rosedale (1922).


10 - GEOGRAPHICAL DATA

Verbal Boundary Description

The nominated property is a portion of the campus of the Columbia Training School and is located in the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 34, Township 4 North, Range 18 West. The nominated property forms a four-sided figure with right angle corners and equal sides of 200 feet each with the center point being the center of the roof ridge of the house. The sides of the figure are parallel to the walls of the house which face approximately the cardinal directions.

Boundary Justification


The nominated property includes the Superintendent's Home and its immediate setting.
