DESCRIPTION DATE 1909 ARCHITECTURAL STYLE Prairie 2 stories, low hipped roof w/wide eaves; main block has FORM tripartite, symmetrical facade w/wing to west MATERIALS frame, stucco 6/6, 8/8 d.h.s., also 2/2/2 in bands; flat wood surrounds FENESTRATION recessed entry behind thick columns in antis, set beneath a FEATURES hipped roof supported on overscaled brackets; window boxes flanking entry also supported on large brackets ALTERATIONS rear addition, finished in half-timber SITE

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE This house is among the limited number of dwellings in Davenport of strong Prairie design. However, the symmetry and focus on the entry also suggest the influence of the Georgian/Federal Revival, which was particularly strong in the city. Prairie features include the horizontality produced by the low hipped roof, wide eaves, and grouping of windows in bands. The entrance, with its stylized columns <u>in antis</u>, combines the neoclassical with an arrangement common to a number of early Prairie houses by Wright and his followers, in both Oak Park and Mason City, Iowa. Although this house is not a pure example of any style, it is representative of the way in which Prairie influences were adapted in Davenport, and as one of the few clearly Prairie-derived houses in the city, it deserves recognition.





## DAVENPORT SURVEY 1982

HISTORICAL DATA Edward C. Roberts had this house built in 1909. Roberts, the son of Uriah and Julia Roberts, was then President of the U.N. Roberts Co. and the Gordon-Van Tine Co. Both firms were local planing mills which were eventually merged into one company. Roberts' mother, Julia, ran the U.N. Roberts Company for nearly 30 years prior to her son's involvement. The Roberts firm was the longest-lived, most successful planing mill in the city.
