



**ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:**

Fifteen-story skyscraper with setbacks; vertically aligned windows are straight-headed. Fire-resistant reinforced steel and concrete construction. "Massive granite base, surmounted by dark mingling shades of rough texture brick and trimmed out with assorted polychrome, dark red, gold and black glazed terra-cotta, which color scheme will form a striking but pleasing contrast."
