DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Billings Townsite Historic District comprises four full city blocks of commercial masonry structures, one to four-and-one-half stories and a large turn-of-the-century railroad depot near the center of Billings, Montana.

The bulk of the structures in the district are of brick with either cast stone or terra cotta ornamentation typical of the Victorian Italianate style. Most are three stories, the lower floor originally devoted to lobby, office and (sometimes) bar and restaurant. The upper floors housed sleeping rooms. a dasta lassestas a presenta constru i fara i e

A relatively homogenenous assemblage of structures of a definite period and character is evident in the district. That character derives mainly from the architectural treatment of the facades, accentuated by bay and oriel windows, decorative cornices and ornamental parapets'. The second second

Following is a description of individual "key" structures in the district. These are designated as "Ia" in the Building Classification Schedule.

1.1.1.1.1.1.1 BLOCK 111 BUILDING 4 2507 Montana Avenue

Western Storefront; 1918(ca.) Builder unknown. Presently the Bargain City Antique store (vacant). One story red brick with buff-colored brick inserts, original facade intact, characterized by buff-colored brick patterns and corbelling. Original cast iron window frame is intact.

Western Storefront Style; 1918(ca.). Builder unknown. Presently the MCIntosh Art Company. One story dark brown brick characterized by an inset panel and corbelled entablature and parapet. Storefront is original except for bulkhead which has been recently shingled.

BLOCK 111 BUILDING 6 Carlin Hotel 2501 Montana Avenue


Second Renaissance Revival style; 1905(ca.). Name of builder is J. Crowe. Three story tan brick, with strong horizontal cast stone banding and lintels. The windows of each facade are organized into simple bold design elements creating a secondary vertical pattern of piers are further accentuated by distinctive cast stone cornice brackets. Original cast iron storefront window frames including leaded plass relites and defined by brick piers with tuscan cast stone capitals are in good condition. Original solid oak entry doors are in equally good condition.

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BLOCK 111 BUILDING 9 Johnson Building - 17 North 26th

Victorian Italianate style; 1918(ca.). Builder unknown. Presently, the Moose Hall and Prior Hotel. This is a two story Fiver-colored brick building, the floor has been surfaced with stucco. This building is unique in the way the windows are treated; a typical "Gibbs-surround": rusticated cast stone quoin-like blocks and flat arch voussoirs. It has a cast stone bracketed cornice and a stepped parapet.

BLOCK 111 BUILDING 10 Hotel Albany - 15 North 26th Street

Victorian Italianate style; 1918(ca.). Builder unknown. Presently the Rescue Mission. This is a three story olive grey brick building, the lower floor altered with tile facing and glass block. The upper windows are uniquely ornamented with cast stone keystones and continuous cast stone sills across the entire facade. The windows are further articulated by recessed brick reveals. It has a pressed metal bracketed cornice at the parapet line.

BLOCK 112 BUILDING-2 McCormick Hotel - 2417 Montana Avenue

An adaption of Renaissance Revival style; 1905(ca.). Builder unknown. Three story grey brick with raised patterns of buff-colored brick and cast stone window lintel keystones. Pressed metal bracketed cornice stepped parapet. Square windows are equally spaced. Original cast iron window frames still intact in both lower storefronts.

BLOCK 112 BUILDING 3 Eagle Hotel - 2415 Montana Avenue

Victorian Italianate Style; 1918, built by Matt Thomas. Three story grey brick. Top floor oriel windows are sheathed in stamped metal and flanked with corbelled piers. Directly below each oriel window is a pair of arched windows with a continuous cast stone sill. A dentilled corbelled band of brick is located at the springline of the arches. Original storefront including ornate pressed metal canopy is still intact. Canopy consists of a Tiffany glass frieze which is backlighted at night. Centered on each side of the canopy is a metal arch surmounted by metal eagles on spheres. Three metal lion's heads support

the canopy's chain ties at the building wall.

BLOCK 112 in photo #1 BUILDING 4 Yellowstone Hotel - 2413 Montana Avenue

Victorian Italianate Style; 1912(ca.). Builder unknown. Two story brick with recently applied coat of textured paint. Original storefront has been replaced in original style. Building has a pressed metal cornice.

BLOCK 112 BUILDING 5 New Oxford Hotel - 2411 Montana Avenue

Victorian Italianate Style; 1918(ca.). Builder unknown. Two story red brick with pressed metal cornice. Two pairs of second floor windows are treated with raised buff brick arched lintels tied together with a continuous raised brick band. Storefront intact with original detail.

BLOCK 112 BUILDING 8 Billings News - 2405 Montana Avenue

Victorian Italianate Style; 1918(ca.). Builder unknown. Two story orange colored brick with pressed metal cornice. Original storefrontalltered. Second floor windows characterized by cast stone keystones and sills. A buff brick raised panel separates the two pair of windows.

BLOCK 112 BUILDING 9 Photo #1 Rainbow Rooms and Bar - 2403 Montana Avenue

Victorian Italianate Style; 1912(ca.). Builder unknown. Two story buff brick with bracketed pressed metal cornice. Original storefront altered. Second floor windows are square with upper relite sections of leaded glass and a continuous cast stone sill.

BLOCK 112 photo 2+2 BUILDING 10 photo 2+2 Rex Hotel - 2401 Montana Avenue

Eclectic Style; 1912. Built by Alfred Heimer. Three story red brick. Facades are characterized byppairs of two story high wooden bay windows at the upper floors. A strong horizontal emphasis is created by continuous bands of cast stone sills and lintels. These are further articulated

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by projected brick soldier courses. A Flemish rococo flavor is interjected into the east facade by semi-circular stepped pseudo-gable parapets. A bracketed red tiled wooden awning exists at the head of the third floor windows. A cantilevered red tiled gabled canopy covers the entrance to upper floors on Montana Avenue. It is characterized by a finely detailed periment, frieze and ridge tiles. Original storefront is intact and has been recently refurbished.

BLOCKI112 BUILDING 11 Fargo Hotel - 14 North 24th Street photo #2

Victorian Italianate Style; 1917. Builder unknown. Originally a grocery store, currently being renovated. Two story red brick with white brick details. Pairs of second story windows are defined by arched white brick lintels with projected white brick keystones. The plane of the front facade is broken up with corbelled bands of white brick at storefront lintel, window sills and top and bottom of parapet.

BLOCK 113 BUILDING 3 Brewery Garage - 2303 Montana Avenue

Eclectic style; 1899. Builder unknown. Currently houses T.V. electronic supply office and warehouse. Two story red brick with mansard-like roof. Pressed metal boxed cornice on all sides. Central mass is distinguished by an elliptical archway with cut stone voussoirs. The building is set upon a cut stone base. The facades are given interest by horizontal corbelled banding.

BLOCK 114 BUILDING 2 p hoto 10 United Glass Warehouse - 2217 Montana Avenue

Industrial style; 1907(ca.). Builder unknown. One and one half stories, red brick. Facade is characterized by a thick band of corbelled brick beneath the parapet. Addriva?

NORTHERN PACIFIC DEPOT 2320 Montana Avenue photo 5

Beaux Arts Eclectic style; 1909. Designed by the chief engineer, Northern Pacific Railway Co., St. Paul, Minnesota. A pair of buff colored single story brick buildings, one the main terminal, the other a restaurant. Exterior intact, interiors altered. Both buildings have steeply pitched gabled roofs with red asphalt tile roofing in a diamond pattern. The main building has two gabled dormers on each side. The main dormer window is arched. A small single window

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occurs on either side. The east and west facades have arched windows with stepped gable parapets with sandstone caps and rusticated sandstone piers at the corners. Main entrance canopy is an ornately decorated stone pediment with rusticated stone piers and eaves. A continuous band of sandstone at the window sills ties the facades together.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

1882-1920

The City of Billings was born with the coming of the Northern Pacific Railroad. As the tracks pushed across eastern Montana, a group of investors formed the Minnesota and Montana Land Improvement Company and purchased this land from the railroad. The townsite was platted in March, 1882; in May, there were three buildings on the townsite. Within four weeks, 5,000 lots had been sold; and by fall, 155 business houses had been built, as well as 99 homes and one church, the Congregational. In the meantime, the railroad itself had reashed the new town and continued westward.

MULTIPLE

Much of the activity of those frantic early days was centered in the area proposed as the Townsite Historic District of Billings. This area is comprised of Blocks 111 through 114 of the original plat of the town, plus the strip opposite along Montana Avenue along the railroad tracks. The starting point for the original survey of the Minnesota and Montana Land Improvement Company is located at the intersection of Montana Avenue and N. 25th St., between Blocks 111 and 112.

Although this was the center of early development of Billings, the buildings there now date from the early twentieth century. Businesses grew and departed, wooden stores were built, then razed and replaced by masonry structures. The present buildings are successors, rather than original occupants of the area. Here stood the headquarters (Northern Pacific) Hotel (1885), in this area was located the site of the first bank in Billings, and the Commercial Hotel (1885). All these are gone, but the railroad tracks remain, and it was the railroads that molded the character of this area.

The Northern Pacific built its tracks through Billings in 1882, and the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy game in 1894, followed by a spur line north connecting to the Great Northern Thus, Billings became a rail center at the junction of three major railroad networks. The Polk's City Directory of 1914 described it this way: "So Billings is now the hub of Railroads extending in ten directions; the Northern Pacific east and west; the Great Northern, north; the Burlington and Northern Pacific with four branches, south and southwest; the Burlington, southeast; a railroad twenty miles long extending northeast, known as the Billings and Central Montana, and a Northern Pacific Branch 100 miles long, extending northwest. Trains departing each morning for the terminus of these branches and returning each evening give Billings a constant transient population probably numbering 1,000 or more." At this time, there were 24 passengers trains a day in and out of the Billings Depot. By 1931, the number of daily passenger trains had increased to 26. By way of contrast, Billings is now served by six (6) passenger trains per week, three going east and three west.

The first depot was built in 1883, but for some reason, it failed to meet the standards of the Northern Pacific Railroad. Instead, the trains stopped to discharge passengers at the

Headquarters Hotel, a few hundred yeards up the track. The present Union Depot was con-

structed in 1909, near the site of the earlier depot. Plans for the building came from the Northern Pacific Chief Engineer's Office, St. Paul, Minnesota.

The railroads and their passengers had a great deal of influence on the types of businesses that grew up along Montana Avenue. The only major manufacturing company was the Billings Brewery (1899-1959), but more than a dozen hotels flourished, with accompanying restaurants, saloons, curio shops and pool halls. In addition to the Headquarters Hotel (1885-1920), there were the Commercial Hotel (1885-1950), the Carlin, the McConmick, the Eagle, the Dallas (later named the Wax), Yellowstone, Oxford, Fargo, Rex, Gage, Albany, El Niblo, and Onyx. All were within two blocks of the depot and served both the passengers of the railroad and the workers on it.

The history of the Rex Hotel is typical of many of the others in the area. It stands at the corner of Montana Avenue and N. 24th Street. The land was purchased February 21, 1910, by Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Heimer. The architect for the building was Curtis Oehme, a local architect, and the contractor was E. O. Blais. The hotel was built in 1916 and served the depot area for 58 years, until the end of 1974, when it finally closed.

The Billings Townsite area has been chosen for designation as a Historic District because it contains a unified architectural representation of an important period (1900-1920) in the development of Billings, and because it embraces the original blocks of the first frantic years of the city's growth. Although the area has begun to decay, with much of the commercial activity represented by second-hand stores, there is renewed interest in revitalizing the area as an anchor for one corner of Billings' Central Business District. The Rex Hotel, for example, now houses an architectural firm and a restaurant. Plans are being made for other adaptable uses in other buildings.


