The Crystal Valley Cemetery is significant for architecture, landscape architecture, and for the important local persons interred there. Like Manitou itself, Crystal Valley Cemetery is laid out in curvilinear fashion taking advantage of the natural topography of its senic setting. Mature silver maples and evergreens are planted in pairs and line the streets. Intermixed are gardens of roses, irises, and lilacs. Green sandstone quarried locally remains the primary building material used for enclosure and retaining walls as well as principal cemetery buildings notably the cemetery chapel and maintenance building. The Richards Mausoleum, also constructed with green sandstone, is significant individually as probably the purist example of Egyptian Revival architecture to be found in the state. Crystal Valley Cemetery has remained the principal cemetery in Manitou Springs since its incorporation in 1882.

### Verbal Boundary Description

Access to the site, which is situated in the southeastern section of Manitou Springs, exists by going south on Plainview Place one and one half blocks until the road terminates in the cemetery. Boundaries for the site abut the Manitou Springs city limit on the east, south, and west, and the termination of Plainview Place on the north.
