DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

. . . .

A two-story building with walls of gray Bedford limestone, the former Second Ward Savings Bank is triangular in shape and occupies a triangular lot bounded by West Kilbourn Avenue, North Third Street, and North Plankinton Avenue. French Renaissance architecture inspired the design. Monumental engaged columns of the Ionic order dominate the elevations; pedimented entrances occur in the central bays of east and west elevations (both nine-bay compositions); and a balustrade surmounts the cornice and surrounds the flat roof.

The exterior has seen no important modifications since the bank opened in 1913. On the interior, the mezzanine, originally limited to the south end of the fabric, was extended along north, east, and west sides in remodelling projects of 1919 and 1924. Conversion from bank to historical society headquarters during the mid-1960's brought additional changes: partitions on the basement level were altered; on the main level, most bank counters were removed and replaced by exhibit areas; three stairways joining main floor and mezzanine were also removed and a new staircase built; library and display spaces were created on mezzanine level. Nonetheless, much of the earlier interior remains--the gray marble flooring of the main story, the green and white marble staircase connecting main floor and basement, the two-story, scagliola-faced Ionic columns, the ornamental plaster ceilings. Intact, also, is the original's serene and classical flavor.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

An officially designated Milwaukee Landmark, this small, graceful Neo-Renaissance building was the work of Milwaukee architects Charles Kirchoff and Thomas Leslie Rose. It was erected for the Second Ward Savings Bank, an institution founded in 1855 and, after reorganization during the next decade, popularly called the "Brewers' Bank" because such leaders of the local brewing industry as Valentine Blatz, Joseph Schlitz, Philip Best, and members of the Uihlein family played important roles in directing its affairs. It was therefore highly important in Milwaukee's commercial life.

In 1928 the bank merged with the First Wisconsin National Bank of Milwaukee, the building then becoming the First Wisconsin's Second Ward Branch. In April, 1965 it was donated to Milwaukee County by the First Wisconsin and eighteen months later reopened as the Milwaukee County Historical Center. Today it houses the collections and exhibits, library and offices, work and storage rooms of the Milwaukee County Historical Society.

The building is an Official Landmark of the City of Milwaukee, so designated in 1969.
