Description:

The Bard Springs Recreation Area is located on Forest Service Road 106 along Blaylock Creek between Blaylock Mountain and Raspberry Mountain in the Cossatot Mountains in Polk County. The bathhouse is a single story structure constructed of field stone and topped with a gabled roof covered with composition shingles. The bathhouse has a single door at either end for access to changing areas. The north and south sides are punctuated with a series of four window openings, each filled with louvers. The structure has no chimney and is set upon a continuous stone foundation. Skylights have been placed in the apex of the gable at each end of the building. Each corner of the building features the curved masonry that slopes inward as it rises from the foundation, a common and distinctive treatment peculiar to CCC construction.

The Bard Springs Bathhouse was constructed circa 1936 by members of the 742nd Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the Mena Camp that was located approximately eight miles to the northwest, near the small town of Shady. It was constructed as part of a small, public recreational complex within the Ouachita National Forest (ONF) as a result of the CCC's emphasis upon recreational construction that began in earnest circa 1935. The extant historic structures within this complex include this bathhouse, two dams, and a picnic shelter (each of which is nominated separately), all of which allowed the area to function purely as a swimming and picnicking facility, as it continues to do today. As such, the Bard Springs Bathhouse remains significant through its associations with the contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps, its associations with the emphasis upon outdoor recreation that guided such construction, and its status as an excellent example of CCC recreational architecture in a remarkable state of preservation.
