45. Description and House Plan:

The Bonta House is a two-story brick residence built in the Italianate style. The original front facade is three bay. The right bay projects in the manner of a T-plan, creating space for a one-story porch which covers the remaining window and door on the front facade. The porch was executed with an arcade motif. Windows are elongated and segmentally arched with stone lintels instead of hood moldings. The low hip roof overhangs the eaves and is supported by brackets. A polygonal bay window projects from the downstairs parlor. The house has a stone foundation. The porch on the rear of the house has been enclosed for a garage. There are also two non-contributing metal sheds used for storage near the rear of the house. See the boundary description for location and size of these as well as that of the ice house ruins.

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

Significance Statement

The A. B. Bonta House is significant under Criterion C as an example of how the late nineteenth century builders in Mercer County used the T-plan to achieve the multi-planed effects popular for Victorian styles on a national level. The Bonta House also demonstrates the use of Italianate-style detailing on a domestic structure with the elongated windows capped by hood moldings, wide eaves with brackets as well as local access to pattern-book detailing in the porch friezes.

Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary was chosen arbitrarily to provide a minimal setting for the house. The outbuildings were excluded because they are of recent construction and are non-contributing.

The boundary includes one contributing building.
