Describe present and historic physical appearance.

Summary: The W. D. Martinez General Merchandise Store/Benson Museum, built in 1921, is an isolated commercial building related to one of Benson's residential neighborhoods at the time Benson was developing into a secondary transportation and trade center for western Cochise County. Today, it is the site of The San Pedro Valley Arts and Historical Society Museum with permanent and temporary displays relating to Benson's history and the arts.

Location and Site: Located on the northwest corner of the intersection of San Pedro and East 5th Streets, the building occupies its original south fifty feet of lots 13, 14, 15 and 16 of Block 18 in the Town of Benson. The adjacent lot to the north, currently serving as a yard, has been added to the property. The building is south of a row of historic, wood frame houses and opposite a largely Hispanic neighborhood east of San Pedro Street.

Construction: The building is a rectangular, one-story structure of approximately 1,688 sq. ft. with a 100 sq. ft. addition (also dating back to the 1920s) to the rear. The foundations are concrete with slab on grade and the walls are 8" thick, poured, reinforced concrete sheathed with stucco. The roof is wood, trussed rafter framing at 3'-0" on center, sheathed with corrugated metal.

Original Appearance: The building's San Pedro Street facade, the gabled end, had a stepped parapet (typical of the historic era), a chamfered corner entry at the southeast corner with 10' high double, carved wooden doors, large fixed-pane, four-light storefront windows on either side of the entry and two-over-two double hung windows. A corrugated metal roofed, wrap-around porch on 4 x 4 posts served both major facades. The rear addition, which functioned as an office, was also of poured concrete and had a corrugated metal shed roof. The interior had jointed concrete flooring, a built-in display platform by the east storefront window and corrugated metal ceilings with redwood crown molding.

Current Appearance: Although the wrap-around porch is a recent replica of the original, the rear addition has tilted due to differential settlement and the building's function has changed, the W. D. Martinez General Merchandise Store/Benson Museum has experienced few alterations over the years. A new double French door has been added to the rear, the electricity has been upgraded, display lighting has been added, ceiling-mounted gas furnaces have replaced the original floor furnaces, and steel shutters have been mounted to protect exterior openings.

Significance: The W. D. Martinez General Merchandise Store/Benson Museum, built in 1921, is significant under National Register Criterion C for its architectural contribution to Benson, Arizona, a town developing into a secondary transportation and trade center at the time. One of Benson's historic structures with an unusual structural system, the W. D. Martinez General Merchandise Store was an isolated commercial building serving the largely Hispanic neighborhood to the east. In spite of its atypical structural system, its stepped-parapeted facade was typical of small commercial structures in America during the historic era.

Chain of Occupancy: William D. Martinez (1867-1932), born in Magdalena, Sonora, built the store in 1921 and leased it in June of that year to S. B. Moss. In January of 1922, Martinez sold the property to Albert Steinfeld & Co., a corporation of Tucson, Arizona. Albert Steinfeld was an immigrant from Germany who became one of the most successful merchants of the west. The property has also been owned by Joseph A. E. Ivey, Jr., who sold it to the San Pedro Historical Society Inc., the present owner, in March of 1983.

Integrity: Other than minor modifications to the building and its change of use, the W. D. Martinez General Merchandise Store/Benson Museum has a high degree of architectural integrity and remains an excellent example of the isolated commercial buildings which related to Benson's residential neighborhoods.




