DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is a fine example of the simple brick design and construction indigenous to the area and the state in the early nineteenth century. Originally it was a rectangular, two story house built directly on the property lines and adjoining the streets to the north and east. The house has been expanded with two brick rear additions (one single story, the other two story) however, these additions have not occasioned the removal of any substantial portions of the original structure, which remains unaltered with the exception of certain changes to doors and windows and the addition of a modern roof. The house has been painted, but restoration to original brick and stone, and restoration of doors and windows could be easily accomplished.

Windows are single-hung sash in well-detailed wood frames which accomodated wood exterior shutters, which have been removed; lintels are brick-arched. Of particular architectural interest is the entrance which is inset with a nicely proportioned arched brick opening, and a delicate, restrained wood canopy which conforms to the structural arch. The original cornice remains, in good condition, and although simple, it exhibits the same good taste and discipline found throughout the house.

Interior details have largely been obscured, but there has been no alteration which would preclude complete restoration.

The central core area of Bowling Green is rich with historic buildings of all types which cumulatively depict the town's entire history and growth; and the Moore House, because of design and location, is an important integral part of this architectural fabric.
