Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The shirt factory is large 250' x 114' and is constructed of shaded red brick. There is an arched roof over most of the structure. About 60' of the structure near 3rd Avenue is 20' narrower than the rest. The main entrance, consisting of three doors, is in this portion and faces the street. It is capped by an ornate canopy. There is an ornamental strip of white masonry the full length of the building. This is the base of the decorative arches made from the arrangement of the bricks. Arched windows fit into these brick arches. Under each arch is a small square window. Under the white strip is anotehr set of windows.

8. Significance



Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The recreation building was built in 1923 and used as a curling rink and hockey rink until 1947 when the building was converted to a shirt factory. The significance of the transition is that the balancing of the male and female parts of the population led to underemployment among women living on the Iron Range. In order to bolster the traditionally weak nonmining sector of the Iron Range economy and to provide employment for the women seeking work, the city made the facility available to a shirt manufacturing The entertainment structure was built during the Progressive period when efforts firm. were made by various social welfare agencies to bolster the opportunities for physical development among the mining populations of the country, and the construction of the facility came at a time preceding the loss of revenues to the state authority resulting from the taxation of local mining properties. The emphasis upon ice rink sports such as hockey and iceskating and curling cannot be explained from the traditional sports involvement of the majority of the population althought significant elements among the city's elites did have such traditions.
