Interior chimneys, each gable end flanked by square attic windows. West end of house also has an exterior door north of chimney and stairway to cellar south of chimney. 16. pegged frames. No water table. No evidence of porch.

Enclosed corner stair arises along partition wall from north end of hall, space taken from parlor. Partition wall is stud & plaster, but stair is housed in vertical beaded boards. Chair railing, beaded batten doors, plain reveals, simple mantel. Parlor fireplace covered. One small mantel up.

House has new roofing; windows covered. Located at edge of broad flat meadow above descent to branch of Taylor Creek. Board and batten dependency and outhouse northwest of house. Stable and new barn northeast of house. Wheeler cemetery on site.

25. 1812, when Bates built Traveller's Rest. Later owned by Henshaw. House was near a main crossroad--Harmony Landing to LaGrange and the river to Brownsboro.

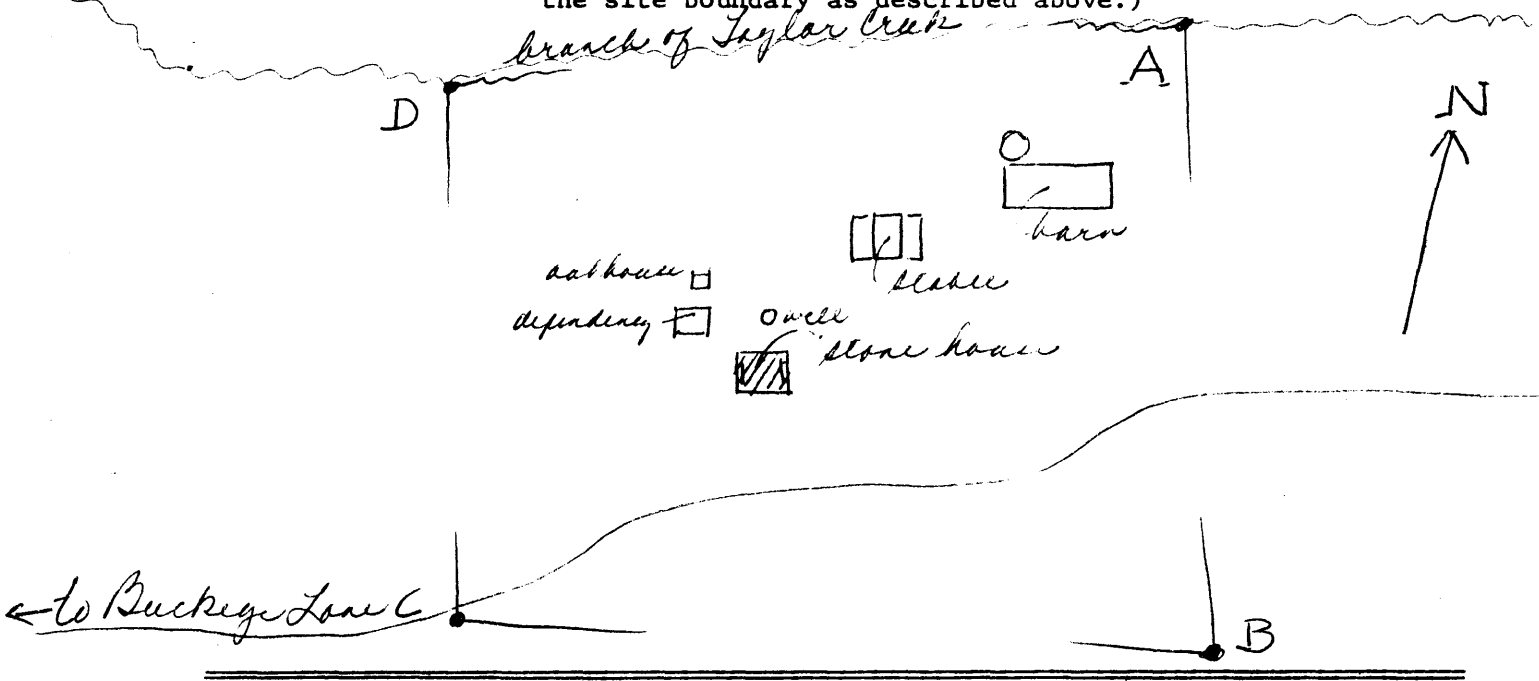
