ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION AND PRESENT CONDITION: Greek Revival cottage. I story raised foundation. Low pitched hip roof with 2 interior chimneys, porch is full width of house and covered with flat roof supported by Corinthian Columns and full entablature. Balustrade is series of turned pillars with classic coping; weatherboard siding; symmetrical front facade with trabeated door and 2 large windows in architrave trim on either side of door. Variation of center hall plan w/ later rear addition. Generally flat site with several large decéduous trees. House is generally in good repair.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE (FROM ORIGINS TO PRESENT): This house was apparently built around 1888 or 1889. A drawn-to-scale sketch appears on the Sanborn (Insurance) Maps of 1889 or 1895. Ernest and Emily Winship Woodruff were living here when their first child, Robert Winship Woodruff, was born in December of 1889. Ernest Woodruff is listed at this address in the city directory of 1891-1892, although George Waldo Woodruff, Ernest's father, was here by 1894, along with Henry Lindsay Woodruff, Ernest's brother. George W. Woodruff is listed here again in the 1896 directory and apparently remained at this address as late as 1906.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL): Local History: This house, located in what was once Columbus' elite "High Uptown" neighborhood, is significant as it was the home of various members of the Woodruff Family of Columbus and Atlanta. Ernest Woodruff, who apparently first resided here, was associated with Columbus' Empire Mills (which was owned and operated by the Woodruff Family) when he lived in this house. He later moved to Atlanta and became president of the Atlanta Railway and Power Co., and a director of the Coca-Cola Co. His son, Robert Winship Woodruff, who was born in this house, is known as one of the nation's major philanthropists and has been called "the mastermind which made Coca-Cola known round the globe.
