

SUMMARY

The Midlothian School was constructed in 1936-1937 by the Works Progress Administration (WPA). Erected in the small, rural village of Midlothian, the school met the criteria of a country school. Although boarded up, the school apparently currently functions as a church with a sign dedicating the property to religious purposes located on a nearby telephone pole and three wooden crosses erected southeast of the school. Situated two and a half miles from State Highway 99 and about four miles south of Chandler, the school maintains its rural setting with no visible buildings being constructed in the immediate vicinity. Containing two-rooms, the school is fairly typical of the WPA constructed education buildings in Lincoln County. Built in the WPA Standardized style, the school exhibits many representative WPA features. These attributes include use of native sandstone, arched entries, a stone chimney, exposed rafter tails, double windows and ribbon windows. rectangular, one-story building is topped by an asphalt covered gable roof with a slightly dropped gable roof extension. The walls are constructed of irregular coursed, polychromatic native sandstone with a concrete foundation. The primary entrances, on the south and west sides, contain single doors sheltered by arched entries. Another entrance is located on the east side. Other than the boarding of all the windows and replacement of some of the doors, the school has not undergone any exterior alteration. The building retains a fairly high degree of integrity.

EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION

The west elevation has one arched entry, two medium sized windows and two small windows. The entry, located just north of the center of the building, is identical to the south entry with voussoirs and a keystone. Additional typical WPA decorative detail visible on this side of the building are the exposed rafters tails. (Photograph 1)

The south elevation of the building contains a centrally located arched entry flanked by two boarded windows. The entry is offset by matching voussoirs and a keystone. A small, square vent window is located high in the gable. On the opposite end of the building, the north elevation, the gable end is devoid of any opening or decorative detail. (Photograph 1 and 2)

The east elevation contains the characteristic WPA ribbon windows. The two sets of ribbon windows are divided by the stone chimney located off-center towards the south. Also on this elevation is a single door accessed by stone steps. This door does not match the other two entries, being square rather than round arched and not having any decorative detail. Exposed rafter tails provide further detail to this side of the building. (Photograph 2)

Located to the west of the school is possibly an old hitching rail for horses. Additionally, to the southeast of the school are three fairly modern wooden crosses.

ALTERATIONS

The building has undergone only minor alterations. Principle among these alterations are the boarding of all windows to protect the building as it is no longer in use. Other alterations include a new metal door, wood door and an air conditioning unit added to one of the windows. These alterations are small in scale and do not adversely impact the integrity of the building. The Midlothian School continues to maintain its integrity of location, setting, design, materials, workmanship and conveys the feeling of its past environment.

SUMMARY

The Midlothian School is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A. The school is historically significant as an example of the work undertaken by the Works Progress Administration (WPA) in Lincoln County, The work relief provided by the WPA allowed many destitute people to survive the trying times of the 1930s while also stimulating the local, and therefore state and national, economies. The Midlothian School is also historically significant due to its educational function. The construction of the new school building allowed for enhanced educational opportunities in Lincoln County during the latter half of the 1930s, the last real era of the small, rural school. The school is further eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C. The building is architecturally significant as a good example of the WPA Standardized style as applied to rural schools. Although a sign near the building indicates the property is dedicated for religious purposes, the school does not derive any significance from this relatively modern function. Contextually, the Midlothian School relates to "The Works Progress Administration (W.P.A.) in Lincoln County, Oklahoma, 1935-1943." The associated property type is WPA Resources, subtype Education-Related Buildings.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

The first plat of Midlothian was filed on 5 September 1904. Growth of the village, however, was never substantial. Composed of twenty-one blocks, the town boasted a few business establishments, a post office and a Fort Smith and Western Railroad Depot. The Midlothian Post Office continued in operation until 15 November 1919. The railroad continued slightly longer, into the late 1930s; however, the last recorded station agent worked only until 1920. A grocery store and gas station remained in the Midlothian area into the 1960s. Other businesses slowly disappeared, leaving only a few remnants of the village including the school building.

The Midlothian School District was organized prior to 1908. First through tenth grades were taught in the frame, three-room school until the early 1930s. At that time the ninth and tenth grades were discontinued to allow those students to attend Chandler High School in Chandler. The WPA approved construction of a new, native stone, two-room school for the district in early September 1936. The construction of the new building produced not only needed jobs for local men but also increased the economic viability of the immediate area. This in turn fortified the state and national economies. The building project further resulted in an improved educational facility which increased the quality of education in Lincoln County while also providing an enhanced space for community events.

The construction plan for the new stone school included the demolition of the old frame building. While erection of the new building was occurring, the students used the local Baptist church. By the end of March 1937, the school was completed and in use. Costing 7,500 dollars, the new schoolhouse was dedicated with a basket dinner on Sunday, 18 April 1937. Following a decline in attendance, the Midlothian School District was annexed to the Chandler School District. Currently, the school is used for religious proposes. This modification in use does not impact the building's significance as it does not fall within the period of significance.

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE

As a WPA building, the Midlothian School is architecturally significant. WPA-built architecture varied in size, shape, exterior features and decorative details; however, all possess one or more unifying attributes that identify it as WPA constructed. As an example of the WPA Standardized style, the Midlothian School is representative of many distinguishing WPA characteristics. These include the use of polychromatic native sandstone for construction material; a simple, functional design; limited architectural features of two round arched entries and a stone chimney; and, minimal decorative details consisting of ribbon windows, exposed rafters and matching voussoirs and keystones accenting the entries. The building remains in good condition, attesting to the quality of work put into the construction project by the local WPA workers.

The Midlothian School is typical of the WPA schools constructed in Lincoln County. It bears a distinct similarity to the Concord, Crescent and Warwick schools. The design of each school is essentially identical. The basic design, however, does not apparently follow any of the available school patterns from the Schoolhouse Planning Division of the Oklahoma State Department of Public Instruction. The type and placement of the majority of exterior and decorative features on these four schools are also basically the same. All four schools have double bands of ribbon windows separated by a chimney and at least three entrances with the majority being round arched with Additionally, the size and placement of entrances and single windows is almost duplicated on each school. Distinguishing characteristics on the Midlothian School, however, include an arched chimney top, one square entrance and placement of the building's entrances. Unlike the majority of WPA schools where the entrances are all round arched with voussoirs, the Midlothian School has one squared off entrance on the east elevation. Additionally, the placement of entrances is also different from the other three schools. On the

Midlothian School one entrance is situated on each of the two side elevations with an additional one on the gable end elevation. This placement of entrances is similar to those on the Pleasant Grove and Mount Vernon schools. Concord, Crescent and Warwick schools all have two side entrances located on opposites ends of the ribbon windows with a third entrance, situated slightly off-center, on the other side of the building. While these differences are only slight, they serve to individualize the Midlothian School.
