

Thomas Demarest House 370 Grand Avenue, Englewood





Thomas W. Demarest was a descendant of David DesMarais and his father was the Rev. Cornelius T. Demarest, a well-known minister of the True Reformed Dutch Church. Thomas W. Demarest entered politics and served in the Assembly, on the Township Committee, as County Clerk, and was one of the incorporators of the Northern Valley Railroad in 1854. The house was occupied after his death by Miss Mary C. Bancker.
