14. History: Daniel Curry, a noted mid-19th century builder in Harrodsburg, bought the lot from the Harris heirs in 1857. Curry built the house and lived in it until 1862 when he sold it to Joseph H. Thompson. The house changed ownership many times before coming to P. Nolen Wilson in 1920. Wilson was the builder of the fort at Fort Harrod and of the Mercer County Courthouse. He and his family occupied the house during the period of the fort's construction (1927). Wilson lived here until 1937.






45. Description and House Plan:

The Curry House is a two-story frame, board and batten structure. Three wall gables extend up into the gable roofline. The front facade is three bays. The windows flanking each side of the central bay are rectangular. The first floor windows are larger than the second floor windows and have ten over ten glazing. The second story windows have eight over eight glazing. The central entrance is covered by a flat-roofed porch supported on each side by two pairs of slender squared columns. The roofline of the porch has a balustrade. The central doorway is accented by sidelights and a transom. In the central wall gable, there is a Gothic window. The eaves on the front facade have bargeboards. The floor plan features a central hall-way flanked on either side by one room. The brick chimneys are centrally located. On the north side is a one-story polygonally-shaped room. To the rear, or west, is a frame ell built in the early twentieth century.

Significance Statement

The Daniel Curry House is significant under criterion C for the period 1857 as an example of how Mercer County builders applied elements such as gothic windows, bargeboards, and board and batten from the Gothic Revival style to a single-pile central passage house.

Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary was chosen to follow the lot lines of the property historically associated with the house.

The nominated area contains one contributing building.
