Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Foss and Wells House at 613 Broadway Street South is located south of Sand Creek just outside of Jordan. It is situated on top of a bank overlooking the creek and a sawmill (which is located on the site of a flour mill operated by the owners of the house during the mid to late nineteenth century). Dispersed dwellings are located in the surrounding area.

The 1858 house is constructed of locally quarried random ashlar sandstone, and is designed in the Italianate style. Characteristic features include the square plan, the low-pitched roof, cupola, bracketted cornice, and round-arched window and door openings. The building is five bays across and two bays deep. Tall, narrow French doors are located in the bays flanking the larger central doorway on the first floor. A door is also located in the center bay of the second floor. Second floor windows are double hung with six over six lights.

Only limited alterations have been made to the building. A second story balcony and three chimneys have been removed. A one story frame addition was constructed on the south side during the 1930s. The cupola remains intact behind the brick covering added in the late 1950s. The building retains a significant degree of original design integrity.

Other buildings on the property include a garage (1964) which is in a deteriorated condition and a stone outbuilding that matches the house in construction and design. This building has been used as a smokehouse and for storage and most recently as a workshop.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Foss and Wells House is significant both for its association with Jordan's early milling industry and for its distinctive stone construction and Italianate design. The house was built in 1858, shortly after Jordan was platted, by Edwin and James Foss and Rufus Wells. Both families occupied the house at that time and jointly owned and operated a nearby flour and grist mill. During the 1860s and 70s, Jordan claimed to be the prime wheat market in Scott County, and milling played a significant role in the town's early and rapid development. Foss and Wells owned the property until 1890. It has been owned by the family of the present owners since 1911. The house is also significant for its distinctive construction and design. The gracious Italianate residence overlooking the town of Jordan bespeaks the pride and prosperity of the families who built it and records one aspect of the community's period of greatest prosperity.
