

## Architecture .

123. This house is one of very few Federal period houses in the county based on the hall and parlor plan type and consistent of a four-bayed main facade. It has the added distinction of an unusual single-storied end addition as well as a singlestoried ell, perhaps the original block. In addition, the original owner was one of the county's founders of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.
