DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Newberry (formerly Newbury) County was one of six counties created in 1785 from the large district of Ninety-Six. Two acres which had been part of the site of a British meeting prior to the Battle of Cowpens in January 1781 were given to the new county in March of 1789 and became the basis for the town of Newberry. The original plat shows the creation of a public square bounded by present day Caldwell, Main, McKibben, and Boyce Streets. Based upon a simple grid system, Newberry was laid out to consist of streets 33 feet wide and 1/4 acre plots. By 1801 a small frame courthouse had replaced the first log structure, and the village began to grow up around the town square. Most of the commercial and public buildings surrounding the square were built between 1850 and 1900 when Newberry was an important stop in the railroad route from Columbia to Greenville.

Structures on the Square include:

(1) <u>Old Courthouse</u> (listed on the National Register): In the center of the public square stands the fourth of five courthouses built for Newberry County. Designed by Jacob Graves, it was constructed ca. 1850 of stuccoed brick in the Greek revival style. Six fluted Tuscan columns support a massive pediment that contains a Reconstruction-era bas relief. There is an intricate Doric entablature and a central stairway with iron railings. The building is surrounded by a landscaped square with carriage-type street lights.

(2) <u>Confederate Memorial Monument</u>: In the park behind the Old Courthouse stands a monument, unveiled in 1880, erected to area soldiers who died in the War Between the States. The terraces on the sides of the monument contain stone blocks that were a part of the old jail which formerly stood on the site.

(3) <u>Old Newberry Bank</u>: The first banking institution in Newberry was established here ca. 1852. This rectangular stuccoed building is brick with a stepped gable and an egg and dart motif on the cornice. The windows are in recessed arches, and the building which is currently used by a savings and loan is adjoined by a landscaped park. A columned classic revival structure was built in 1912 to house another financial institution. It now adjoins the original bank.

(4) <u>Newberry Opera House</u> (listed on the National Register): The Opera House, designed by G. L. Normann as a brick Gothic-derived structure, was constructed in 1882. It served for many years as the center of cultural and civic activities for Newberry. The ground floor is currently used as a city hall.

The District includes the Public Square and the surrounding blocks with storefront facades. From the old Newberry Hotel on the Southeast corner of Main and Caldwell streets go (northwest) for one block on Caldwell Street, left (southwest) on Boyce Street for two blocks, left (southeast) for one block on McKibben Street, and left (northeast) for two blocks on Main Street. District also includes one block of Boyce Street from Caldwell'Street to College Street (northeast) and one block of Caldwell Street from Main to Friend Street (southeast).

(5) <u>Old Hotel</u>: The Newberry Hotel was opened by 1880 and is of stylized Romanesque revival design. The first floor is rusticated and a corner tower overlooks the public square. No longer used as a hotel, it now houses offices and business establishments.

Low profile commercial structures of one and two stories surround the public square. The earlier buildings date prior to the War Between the States and mostly have stepped gables of brick. Intricate brickwork distinguishes the upper facade of other structures; a number of cast iron fronts are also of note.
