7. Description

Bittersweet is set in the pretentious section of Main Street in Franklin. The house is constructed of pitsawn lumber and has clapboard siding. It has a two-story temple form with four square Doric pillars and a side hall plan with a front and rear parlor on each side. There is also a modern rear wing with a large bedroom upstairs and a family room downstairs. Details include shoulder molded fenestration, six over six windows, drip molded cornices over the doors, aedicule motif mantels with layered entablatures, and a newel post in the hall in the shape of a great "S" curved volute. The present owner has added cornices in the downstairs parlors and small plaster garlands to the downstairs mantels. However, these additions are clearly discernable from the original fabric and have had minor visual impact. Other changes have included the installation of bathrooms and closets.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Criterion C

Bittersweet is significant in the area of architecture as an unusual example of a Greek Revival residence in Louisiana. The use of a side hall double parlor plan set within a temple inspired form such as at Bittersweet was common for pretentious residences in the eastern states. But it was seldom seen in Louisiana where galleried houses without pediments overwhelmingly predominated. Bittersweet, taken within its context, can therefore be said to have achieved an extremely high level of sophistication.
