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## Architectural Description

Carrying an unpaved road across Spring Creek about 3 miles northeast of Wakonda, Bridge No. 14-060-032 is a 30-foot single-span, deck, concrete arch with solid, concrete railings ornamented with 4 recessed panels. Springing from grade, the arch is semicircular in configuration and about 25 feet in clear span. The abutments have sloped, flared wing walls. Paired strands of steel wire protrude from the spandrel-wall surface on both elevations. The bridge retains excellent integrity.

## Statement of Significance

Bridge Number 14-060-032 is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places as part of the "Historic Bridges in South Dakota" Multiple Property Nomination. It is related to the historic context of "Historic Bridges in South Dakota, 1893-1942" and is classified with the associated property type for reinforced concrete highway bridges. This bridge is individually eligible for the National Register under Criterion C as the only surviving example of a concrete deck arch in Clay County. The bridge retains excellent integrity.

By the early 1910s, reinforced concrete came into use in South Dakota for the construction of bridges. The earliest concrete bridges in South Dakota were built in the southeastern portion of the state, and many, if not all of these structures were professionally designed. However, while the construction of steel bridges had been monopolized by out-of-state firms. These same out-of-state steel bridge companies never seemed to monopolize the concrete bridge building market. Instead, many local contractors successfully competed in this aspect of the bridge building business.

Bridge No. 14-060-032 has been assigned a construction date of 1940 by the State Highway Department. However, it is doubtful that either the state or the county would have built a 30-foot concrete arch with a 15-foot roadway at that late date. If a concrete bridge had been designed for the site in 1940, it probably would have been a simple slab with a roadway wider than 16 feet. This bridge was probably built before the establishment of the State Highway Commission in 1919. According to Clay County Commissioners Records, the county began building concrete bridges as early as 1914. In view of the fact that the bridge is the only concrete arch surviving in the Clay County, and one of only 18 surviving in the state, it represents a rare example of a type.

### Verbal Boundary Description

The nominated property consists of a rectangle, 20 feet by 35 feet, whose vertices coincide with the outside corners of the bridge abutments at each end of the bridge, and includes only the bridge superstructure and the substructure.

### Boundary Justification

Because the bridge is located on a public road, there are no legal boundary lines for the ends of the bridge. Therefore, these boundaries are drawn to encompass only the superstructure and substructure of the bridge itself.
