18. Windows are 6/6 pane. Interior gable-end chimneys set off the structure which rests on a dressed limestone foundation. Two 6/6 pane pedimented dormers pierce the facade and rear roofs. The gable roof, covered in tin, is accented with a boxed cornice. The interior displays Federal features such as chairrailing in the central hallway and both rooms, wallpresses in both rooms and symmetrical woodwork. A two-run open stairway leads to the upper level. No outbuildings associated with the structure exist today.
20. Federal style center passage houses documented in the survey, it is representative of a popular building style in the county.

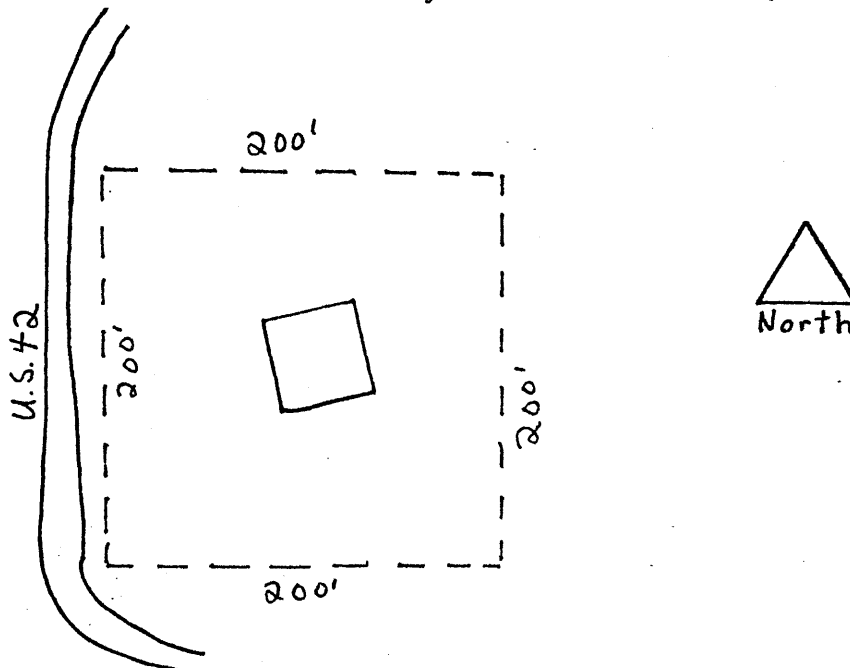
