

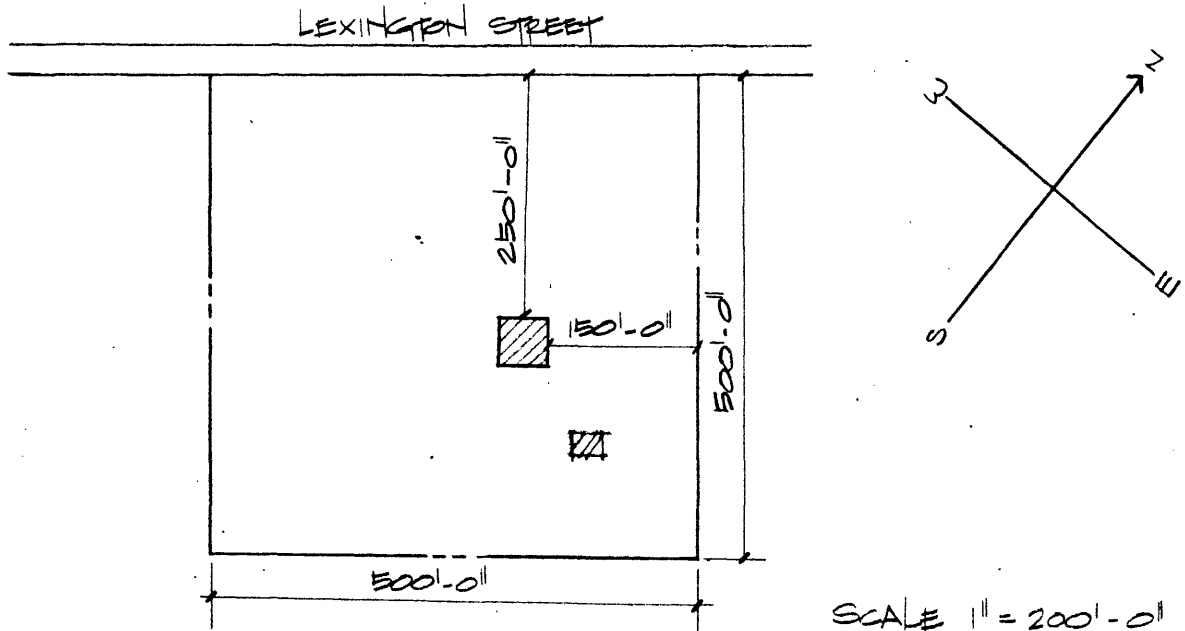

The boundary contains the house and one barn outbuilding of the same period as the house.



Sketch of Site Plan (Showing outbuildings, structures, landscape features and the site boundary as described above.)

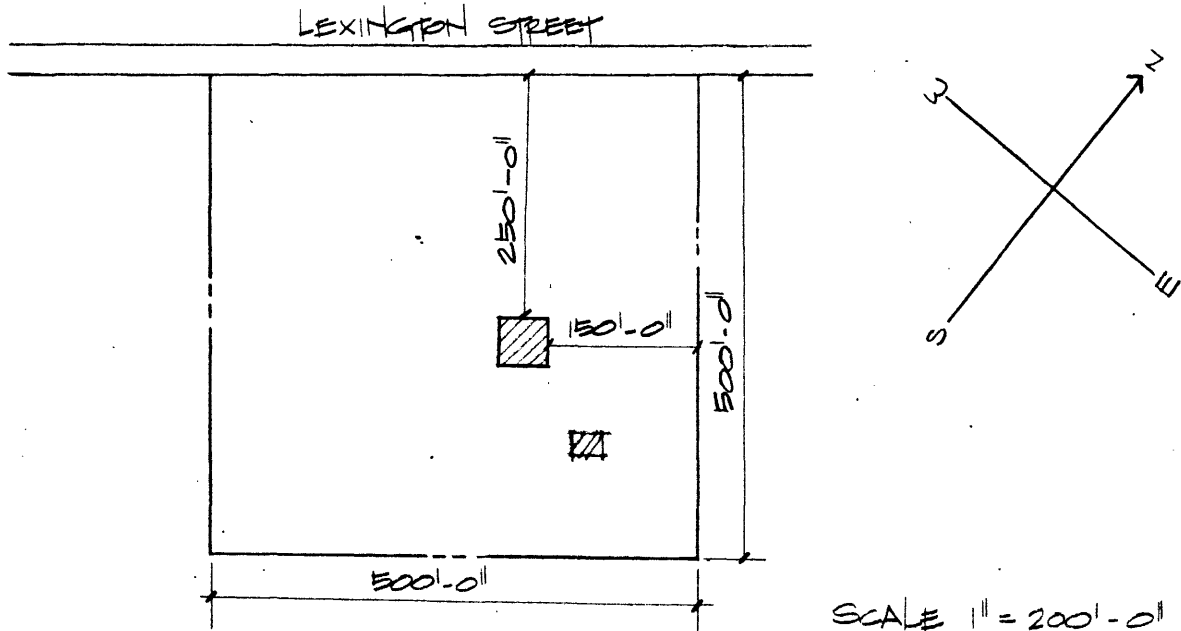
