4. Owner: Sammy Martinez, 1524 8th, Las Vegas, N.M. (Same as #1988.)
7. Description: Random ashlar/rubble sandstone foundation and walls; wood shingle roof; small enclosed eaves; 2/2 double-hung windows with stone sills and segmental arches; chamfered porch posts with molding "capitals"; single door with transom.  
This Vernacular Stone house is in the mixed residential and institutional area, described with discussion of the Post Office, Building #512.
8. Significance: This house is at the middle of a cluster of modest historic houses dating to the early 1880's. It is a fine, unaltered example of a local Stone Vernacular type. Its facade symmetry and chamfered porch posts with "capitals" show the influence of classical architecture, probably the Greek Revival. The earliest residents are unknown, although later city directories record Joseph Joquel, printer and wife (1908), Felipe Chacon, editor and wife (1912/13), and Frank and Fannie Hayes, a barber and dress maker (1919).
