

7. Description

This 9.4 mile section of state maintained Route 66 serves as a frontage road along Interstate 40 from west of the Iyanbito exit ramp to the state police station at Rehobeth located near the east interchange of I-40 at Gallup. During the 1930s the road section was improved and finally paved in 1937. The alignment served as a part of Route 66 until it was replaced by I-40 after 1956. The road's course down the valley of the Rio Puerco of the West with red Entrada sandstone cliffs forming an unbroken wall to the north offers motorists a strong feeling of travel along Route 66 in the 1930s and 40s. Although I-40 closely parallels the western portion of this section of Route 66 and the road has received some alterations as a result of routine maintenance, the historic alignment, cross-section template, and surrounding landscape remain largely intact. Brown and white signs denoting "Historic Route 66" have recently been erected by the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department along the roadside.

The road section passes through the broad valley of the Rio Puerco of the West as its descends from the continental divide a few miles to the east. Several concrete box culverts dating to the paving of the road in the 1930s mark small arroyos. The alignment approximates the tracks of the former AT&SF Railroad, and I-40 parallels Route 66 to the south. At Ft. Wingate, a former army ordnance depot, a spur of the railroad crosses the highway. The road section ends where the highway widens to four lanes as it enters the Gallup commercial strip.

8. Significance

Designated as State Highway 6 in 1914 and a part of the National Old Trails Highway, a trans-regional road association that preceded the creation of the federal highway system in 1926, the road from Iyanbito to Rehobeth remained a gravel road until the 1930s. Funding under FAP 27 as well as several New Deal

projects resulted in the improvement and paving of the highway in 1937. Notable for west-bound motorists were the striking sandstone cliffs to the north and increasing evidence of Navajo homesteads, or outfits, lining the road. This roadside geology and cultural landscape served to reinforce Gallup's efforts to promote itself as "the heart of Indian country," part of the attraction of automobile travel along Route 66 in New Mexico. This section of state-maintained Route 66 is significant for its association with the rise of automobile tourism in New Mexico and thus is eligible under Criterion A.

Verbal Boundary Description

This property is 9.4 miles long and is maintained as a frontage and local road by the New Mexico State Highway and Transportation Department. The east end lies at the junction of Route 66 and the westbound exit ramp of I-40 at the Iyanbito interchange, and the west end is at the State Police station at Rehobeth one-half mile east of the junction of Route 66 and I-40 at the east end of Gallup. The sides are a corridor extending fifty feet on either side of the centerline, marking a right of way of 100 feet, a minimum width used by the State Highway Department during the 1930s.

Boundary Justification

The boundary includes the entire parcel historically associated with this section of Route 66.
