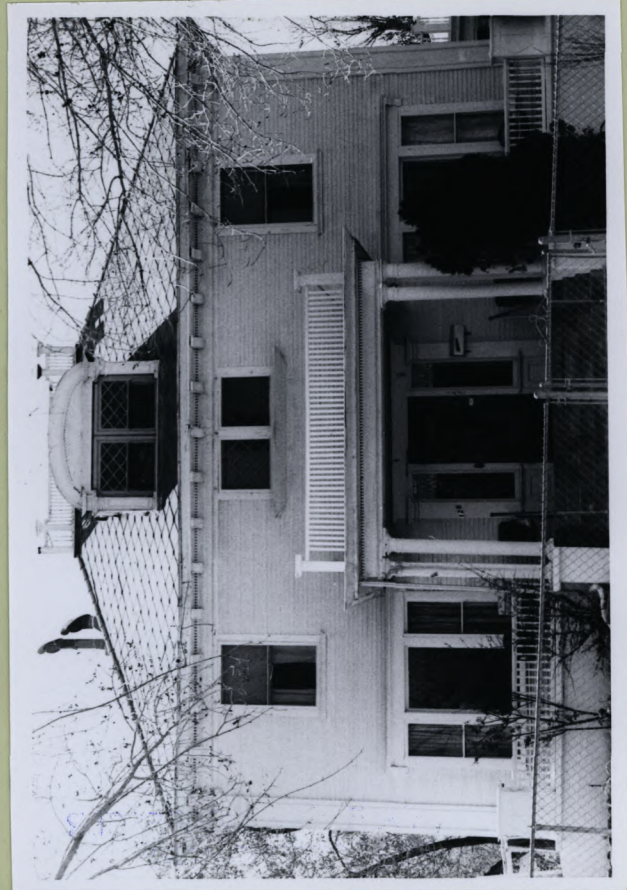

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION

The Sloan residence is a two-and-one-half-story frame structure 40 feet square. With minor exceptions, the house is symmetrical in both plan and massing. The hipped roof is truncated, its deck surrounded by a short railing. Three of the facades feature a central portico with free-standing columns. A dormer window is located in the roof over the front portico. Detailing of the eaves is classical. Exterior wall surfaces are covered with thin horizontal siding; the corners of the building are articulated with pilasters.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The house is noteworthy for two reasons. First, it was built and occupied by Richard E. Sloan, a prominent Arizona attorney whose extensive public service was climaxed by appointment as the last Territorial Governor. The second point is that his home may be the best example of Georgian Revival architecture in Prescott. The design was executed by an architect, Bidwell, who also supervised its construction.
