Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Zachry-Kingston House is located in a rural area just south of the community of Buckhead, near the banks of the Oconee River in southeast Morgan County, Georgia. The house is a two-story wood-framed plantation plain-style structure with Federal detailing, built around 1830 and restored in 1985.

The front facade of the house has five windows on the second level, four windows on the first level, and a central portal with transom and sidelights, and projecting entrance portico. The house rests on a brick foundation and has a brick chimney on each side of the building and a gabled roof with new wood shake shingles. The rear facade has a shed roof. During the 1985 restoration, the exterior weatherboarding and windows were replaced "in-kind," and the brick chimneys were reconstructed. The front porch was restored to its projected original appearance based on an analysis of the exterior and interior architectural details.

The interior of the house consists of two rooms over two with central stair hall and two rear shed rooms. Interior details include original plaster walls, wide randomwidth wall boards in the hall, original staircase with balustrade, wood-grained paneled doors, marbelized baseboards, original hand-planed mantels, and floors. Some of the woodwork in the two rear shed rooms has been replaced.

The house sits on a low rise of ground and commands a view of the rural countryside in all directions. The existence and location of the original historic kitchen and well have been identified. The property owners have added two outbuildings which consist of a historic barn which is not original to the property and a recently constructed one-room building to the right rear side of the main house. A well is located adjacent to the right side of the house. The property is landscaped with flowering plants, pecan and walnut trees.

The boundary of the nominated property consists of the house and its immediate high-ground setting. Because the significance of the property derives primarily from the architectural characteristics of the house (particularly the interior), extensive rural acreage has not been included.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Zachry-Kingston House is significant in the area of architecture as a good example of a pre-Civil War "plantation plain" style house constructed around 1830, located in the Piedmont region of the state. The house is particularly significant for its virtually intact interior which consists of original plaster walls, wide random width wall boards, original staircase and balustrade, wood-grained paneled doors, marbelized baseboards, original hand-planed mantels, and floors. The interior plan of two rooms over two with central hall and two rear shed rooms is also an important characteristic of the style. All of these features are representative of the simple pre-Civil War interiors that were found in "plantation plain" type houses in the northern half of the state in the mid-19th century. Few of these interiors have survived intact today without major alterations. The 1985 restoration of the exterior with "in-kind" materials provides a compatible "setting," in a sense, for the preservation of a rare and authentic antebellum interior. The restoration also maintained the overall form and arrangement of the house and its original heavy timber framing system. For these reasons the Zachry-Kingston House meets National Register Criteria C because it embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type and period of construction.
