Description

One-and-one-half story, brick (common bond) building. Facade and rear elevation have stepped parapets. Windows in original portion (left side) are arched with radiating voussoirs and two-over-two sash. Windows on facade light offices located at the front of the building; these offices are one room deep and two stories high. The remainder of the interior is open. Original portion of building has slightly gabled roof. 1960s addition (right) has a flat built-up roof. All elevations contain loading and drive-in bays.

The Old Brick Warehouse, constructed between 1903 and 1908, is the oldest extant tobacco warehouse and is believed to be the first brick tobacco warehouse in Mullins.2 it is significant for its association with the marketing of tobacco in the area.
