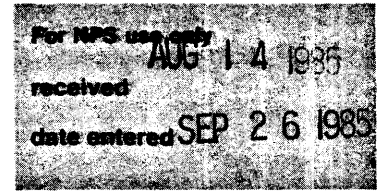

4. Owner: Dorothy L. Sanchez, 2203 N. Gonzales, Las Vegas,
N.M.

7. Description: Concrete coping at foundation; stucco over wood
frame with end boards, terneplate roof; small eaves with exposed
cut-out purlin ends; cut-out applique in gables; tall 1/1 double-
hung windows with projecting sills, eared frame with applied
bosses and "keystones;" single door with transom. Located in
residential area of later construction, two blocks north of the
Plaza.

8. Significance: This is one of the few wooden, picturesque cot-
tages built in Old Town soon after the arrival of the railroad.
Its asymmetrical plan was probably taken from a builder's pattern
book while its wood details are faintly Eastlake in style. The
first owners are unknown, although Francisco Serna occupied the
house in 1919, followed by long time residents Frank and Amalia
Blanchard.
