Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Mariposa County High School Auditorium is a symmetrical, stucco-sided Spanish Revival or Eclectic building with a Spanish tile roof (McAlester 1984: 417-430). The two-story building is composed of two wings, which project from either end, and form an attractive patio. Over the doors and windows, and on the front facades, are decorative Spanish tiles. The entrances are flanked by pseudo-Grecian urns. The front of the building is made up of three sets of paired vertical windows, which retain the same massing and scale as the original gridded windows, which were removed in the last twenty years in an effort to retrofit the building. Other than changing the windows, the only other alterations have occcurred in the interior of the building to make it suitable for school functions and other activities. Overall the exterior of the building retains integrity.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Mariposa County High School Auditorium contributes to the architectural heritage of the old town of Mariposa and stands alone as a fine example of Spanish Colonial Revival architecture. The building, which was constructed in 1936-7, reflects the craftsmanship and skills of its Works Progress Administration workforce. This building is Mariposa's best example of the Spanish Colonial Revival style and one of very few architect designed buildings in this small town. William Weeks was perhaps the state's pre-eminent designer of school buildings. His designs show careful attention to detail and graceful proportions, and Mariposa's High School Auditorium exhibits those characteristic qualities.

Construction began on January 7, 1936 and was completed on April 1, 1937, with dedication ceremonies held on April 30th of that year. The building was built with a federal grant of \$66,236 from the WPA and a county bond issue of \$85,000. Weeks designed the building and William Spivok of San Francisco was the contractor. When the building was completed it was among the city's largest buildings and perhaps the most expensive. Given that Mariposa was and is the county seat, most of the county's population attended the high school and functions in the school's auditorium. Today, the building remains a prominent landmark in Mariposa County. It is also Mariposa's only historic school building that retains integrity.
