4. Owner: Felipe Peña, 1112 Mora, Las Vegas, N.M. (same as #1639).
7. Description: Stuccoed foundation; stuccoed wood frame walls with end boards; wood shingle roof; small overhang with frieze boards; 1/1 double-hung windows with wood surrounds and (some) with molding cornices, fixed window with transom; two single doors with transoms (1 each porch); window bay with wooden eave brackets and terneplate roof; stuccoed porch wall and piers with caps, ogee arches. Located in the Sulzbacher and Rosenwald Addition discussed earlier with Building #1559.
8. Significance: An interestingly detailed Wood Vernacular house of the 1880's. The Rosenwald street facade (left in ill. 60) has a symmetrical arrangement of windows and centered gable reminiscent of the Ft. Marcy officer's house plan of the early 1870's. The Eleventh Street facade breaks into a bit of asymmetry derived from the newly arrived picturesque cottage type, including also a handsome window bay with ornate eave brackets and a terneplate roof. During the 1920's, a new porch was added to the front using the local folk ogee arches.
