18. Description

2-story frame Federal style house (original clapboards now covered with asbestos siding) with five-bay facade and central doorway with elliptical fanlight and sidelights. There is a single-story ell to rear. The house overlooks Howe Reservoir. A later full-length front porch partially obscures the doorway, which is similar to those on the James (#40) and Rufus Piper (#29) houses. 6/6 windows. A new 1-story 3-stall garage, white clapboarded, has been added ^{new} to the back ell. To northwest across field is a 2-horse shed with vertical pine siding. Set in open sloping fields, bordered by woods, the house overlooks Howe Reservoir and Monadnock.

19. History

Built c.1825-30 by Samuel Allison (1795-1880) Captain of Militia, Selectman 1842-44, who in 1830 built sawmill at Howe Reservoir (site near present Carroll house). After Allison moved to Marlborough (1848) the mill was operated by the next four owners of this house, for whom the last Micah Howe (1801-1883) the present Howe Reservoir was named.

20. Significance

Federal style farmhouse associated with the Allison family, long prominent in Dublin annals, the development of small industries in 19th-century Dublin, and with the naming of Howe Reservoir.

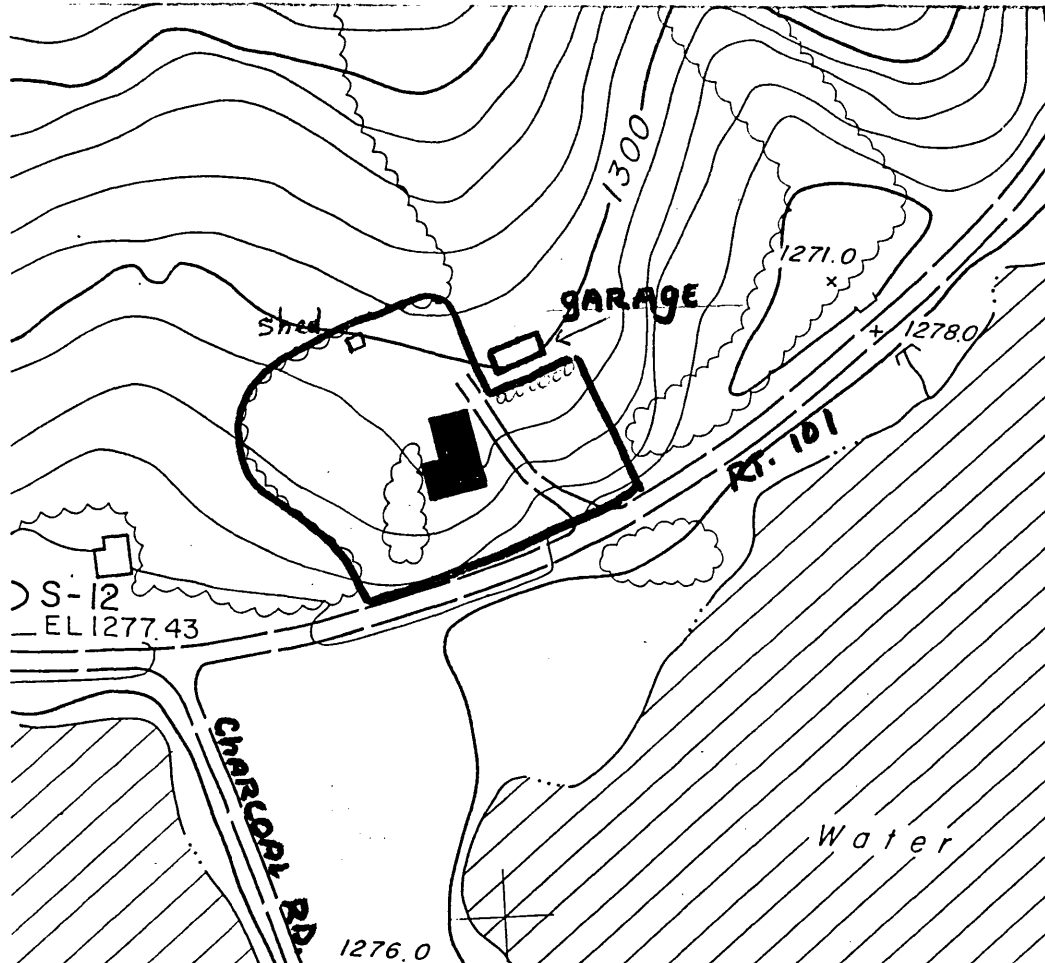

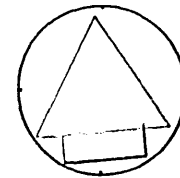
